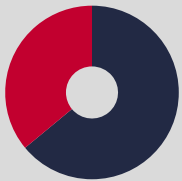
FAST FACTS: 2015-16 SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

PREPARING TO LAUNCH

The opening season of the first-ever Girl's Development Academy is set for fall 2017.

In 2016, U.S. Soccer announced 71 Clubs to participate in the inaugural season. Across six geographic regions, the Girl's DA will standardize the best playing environments for approximately 5,000 of our nation's most elite female athletes.

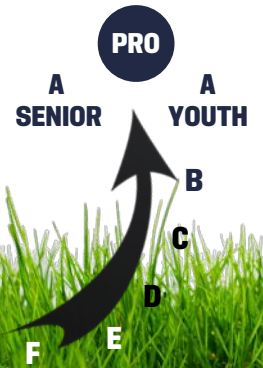

LICENSE PATHWAY



In 2016, with the support of donors like you, U.S. Soccer made unprecedented strides in professionalizing the coaching landscape.



Together, we are working to produce the highest-quality coaches who will develop players at all ages and abilities across the United States.

This year, U.S. Soccer:

- Launched separate and specialized A-license coaching pathways designed around the unique needs and best practices of youth vs. senior team coaching.
- Raised the minimum standard for individuals seeking to become professional coaches through the initiation of the first-ever Pro Course. (Previously the highest level of licensing obtainable in the U.S. was an A License.)

DIGITAL COACHING CENTER

U.S. Soccer launched the DCC in 2015. By the end of 2016, the platform already had more than **120,000 users** accessing the online resources, licenses and training tools for coaching best practices and success.



FIRST PRO LICENSES

Thirteen professional MLS and U.S. YNT coaches completed the Pro Course pilot program over the last 12-months, **setting new standards for the next generation of coaches.**



GROUND-BREAKING FACILITIES

U.S. Soccer broke ground on the **state-of-the-art National Coaching Development Center**, to be completed in Fall 2017 in Kansas City.

SENIOR TEAM SUCCESS

The U.S. Men's National Team advanced to the Semifinal round of the historic Copa America Centenario. The MNT also advanced to the Final Round of CONCACAF Qualifying for the 2018 FIFA World Cup in Russia. The U.S. Women's National Team won the first-ever SheBelieves Cup, the world's newest and most prestigious women's tournament featuring England, France, Germany and the United States.

BOYS BUILD A FOUNDATION

In 2016, every boys team between the U-17 and U-20 levels won an important international tournament, with the U-18s managing to run through their matches against club and international sides with a sterling 13-0 record.

PARALYMPIANS INSPIRE

Thirteen U.S. Soccer Paralympians represented the U.S. in Rio during the 2016 Paralympic Games. United States Army veteran and defender Josh Brunais was chosen by a vote of fellow Team USA members to serve as the U.S.'s flag bearer for the Closing Ceremony.

U-20 WOMEN COMPETE AGAINST THE WORLD'S BEST

The U.S. Under-20 Women's National Team finished fourth at the 2016 FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup, hosted in Papua New Guinea. The U-20 Women have now finished in the top four in six of the eight U-20 Women's World Cups it has contested.

U-15 GIRLS ARE 2016 CONCACAF CHAMPIONS

The U-15 Girls won the USA's first regional title at this age level. Six players earned CONCACAF All-Star honors and the team swept individual awards - Golden Boot (Payton Linnehan and Gabrielle Robinson), Golden Glove (Ruth Jones) and Golden Ball (Mia Fishel).





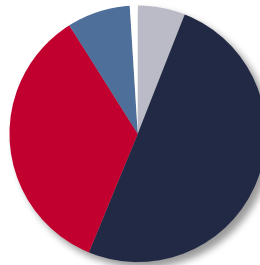
ABOUT U.S. SOCCER

RECOGNIZE TO RECOVER

In 2016, U.S. Soccer launched the first-of-its kind program to help elevate player safety and educate coaches, players, parents and referees about the prevention and management of injuries.

Developed with the help of medical experts, these tools, available online and shared directly with Member organizations, focus on concussions, injury prevention, environmental awareness (extreme hot or cold) and emergency action planning.



HALL OF FAME IN THE MAKING

This year, U.S. Soccer finalized plans and broke ground on a new National Soccer Hall of Fame, due to open in 2018 in Frisco, TX.
