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#### The Bible Is Primarily an Eternal Book

This is a dated guide for reading through the Bible with an awareness of eternity. Most of the time we apply the Bible to this earthly life, but its focus is eternity. The eternal world came first, then came the earth and heaven. The eternal realm created the natural realm. When we die in the Lord, believing in Jesus, we return to live with Him forever in the realm of everlasting life.

"He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life." (John 3:36 KJV).

#### BibleGuide Readthrough—You Can Start Reading on Any Day

This reading guide is dated, but not everyone will be able to start on January 1. Whenever you begin, find that date and start there. In that way, we will be reading the same chapters together on the same days of the year. At the end of the year, keep reading to complete the entire Bible.

#### Allow Holy Ghost to Explain the Scriptures

The Bible is the inerrant Word of God and the Holy Ghost gave the writers divine connectivity. When you read several sections daily, you get a broad perspective of Holy-Ghost insights on the eternal world from God's perspective. You see how the New Testament authors interpreted the Old Testament in ways that those books had never been interpreted until Jesus came and sent the Holy Ghost.

- In the syntopical Bible reading system that we use, we read four chapters daily from these eight categories of books in the Old and New Testaments:
- **Pentateuch.** Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy. The Pentateuch [pronounced PIN tuh tuke], also known as the Books of Moses, Book of the Law, the Law, and the Torah, is a Greek term meaning "five-volumed." The Pentateuch includes the first five books of the Old Testament.
- **History.** Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1 Samuel, 2 Samuel, 1 and 2 Kings, 1 and 2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther, Acts. All of these history books except Acts are in the Old Testament and give us important details of Middle East history before Jesus was born. The historical book of Acts, written by Luke, who also wrote a Gospel, gives the history of the church in the First Century, after the Lord Jesus Christ was crucified and raised from the dead. All of history today is divided into B.C. (Before Christ) and A.D. (Latin words Anno Domini, meaning "In the Year of Our Lord). All of modern history—not just church history—is dated A.D. because Jesus' death, burial, and resurrection changed the earth forever.
- **Poetry**. Job, Psalms, Song of Solomon, Ecclesiastes. Many of the Psalms were written by King David. Song of Solomon and Ecclesiastes were written by his son King Solomon who became cynical in his later years because of sin, and his writings reflect it. Those writings are still included in the Bible for us to study them and gain more understanding of fallen human nature.
- **Wisdom**. Proverbs *(repeated during the year)*. Many of the Proverbs were also written by King Solomon. James in the New Testament is also considered a book of wisdom, but we read James in the group of Epistles (letters written to the churches).
- **Prophets**. Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah, Malachi. All of these men received prophetic insight from God. They spoke it out publicly and also wrote it down for

posterity. Many were persecuted in their day for telling the truth, which included God's wrath against the sins of national leaders.

- **Gospels**. Matthew, Mark, Luke, John. These accounts of Jesus' life were written by four different people. Each author chose a slightly different emphasis, but the accounts of Jesus' life are all in harmony with one another. Matthew, Mark, and John were eyewitnesses of Jesus' life as His disciples. Luke came along soon after. Luke wrote an authoritative account of Jesus' life in the Gospel of Luke and also wrote the historical book of Acts.
- **Epistles**. Romans, 1 Corinthians, 2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1 Thessalonians, 2 Thessalonians, 1 Timothy, 2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon, Hebrews, James, 1 Peter, 2 Peter, 1 John, 2 John, 3 John, Jude. "Epistle" is another word for letter. In the days of the church, there were no modern means of communication such as we enjoy today. These Christian leaders received messages from God, wrote them down in letters, and sent them among the churches for their spiritual growth.
- **End Times**. Daniel, Revelation *(repeated during the year)*. The book of Daniel was written by the Old Testament prophet Daniel. Revelation, the last book of the New Testament, was written by John, Jesus' beloved disciple. Both books contain insight about eternity and heaven and the unseen world of spiritual forces as well as details about the future on earth that have not yet come to pass.

#### As you read the Bible, learn to interpret it with spiritual eyes

Compare spiritual things with spiritual things (1 Corinthians 2:13). Spiritual things require meditation, so take your time. Write notes as you read and pray.

#### Don't let others define you. Keep growing in God

What you are becoming is way more important than what you are going through. Get God's view on everything. Jesus sent you the Holy Spirit to help you, so ask for His help. Stay centered on the things of God. Your emphasis is the eternal, not the carnal.

#### Eternity is not deep. It's reality

Eternity Training takes us where we should have been centuries ago. It gives us an appetite for becoming like Jesus and living our lives with eternity in view, staying focused on the things of God. The eternal world is the world where you belong. If it's unfamiliar to you now, you can develop a lasting familiarity with that world this year.

## Living Life with Eternity in View

A MESSAGE FROM BISHOP WELLINGTON BOONE

It's time for a transformational revival, built on the Bible. In the past we have seen revivals come and go, but the ones that lasted were built on the Bible.

Sometimes you hear that someone is so spiritually minded they're no earthly good, but that is a nonsense statement. You can't do any real good on earth until you are spiritually minded. You have to see God, Who is spirit. Jesus said in John 4:24 (NLT), "God is Spirit, so those who worship him must worship in spirit and in truth." Spiritual worship is a foundation of the truth.

The whole history of the world changed immeasurably with the coming of Jesus, His death, and His resurrection. The creeds in this booklet define Who He is and what you must believe if you say you are born again.

Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to be in you and unveil the Son to you. John 3:16 says you became someone new by being born again and you were given access to eternity—everlasting life.

"God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life."

We became imitators of God as dear children (Ephesians 5:1). Instead of focusing on this earthly, temporary world, we focus on the world of eternity.

**Eternity is the real world where God lives**. To the extent that you develop an eternal view, you see everything in a new way, from God's perspective. You see what heaven looks like with Jesus seated on the right hand of the Father. That's not mental understanding. It's supernatural understanding. It comes from God.

**God created everything that exists in heaven and earth, including you**. You came from eternity, live in eternity now, and will go to eternity when you die—eternal life if you accepted Christ or eternal punishment if you rejected Him. That's the message of John 3:16 and John 3:36.

When you live with eternity in view, you see the end from the beginning. You see where you came from and where you are going. You see destiny.

You can train yourself to be sensitive to the eternal dimension. Eternity training resumes each morning as you get alone with God, read through the Bible, and pray. Your focus on eternity during that private time with God can stay with you all day long.

**Eternity is found in every book of the Bible.** Many, many passages speak about eternity. A few are listed in this booklet. You might miss them if you stay focused on your problems, so refocus on the real world of everlasting life.

**Jesus said some people are spiritually blind** (Luke 4:18). He opened their eyes. He not only opened the eyes of the physically blind. He also opened the eyes of the spiritually blind who were looking at things with man's wisdom when they needed to be looking with God's wisdom.

#### You Will See Eternity Everywhere as You Read Through the Bible

Many of the things that God is showing us about the eternal dimension have already been in the Bible for thousands of years. We have already read the Bible through and through. Our tendency is to acknowledge that we already know these things, but not necessarily to ask God to open our eyes to see what we have missed. The goal of this BibleGuide is to take you through the whole Bible in one year, showing you what you have missed, refocusing your view on Eternity, which God reveals in every book.

The great attraction of eternity is God the Father and, in particular, the person of His Son Jesus Christ the Lamb slain from the foundation of the world, the Mediator between God and man, the Man Christ Jesus, seated on the throne!

And Jesus said of the Holy Ghost, "All that the Father has is mine; therefore I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you" (John 16:15 ESV).

As Holy Ghost opens your understanding, you will see that you have been saved but living in darkness. Jesus came to deliver you out of darkness. He sent you a Helper, the Holy Spirit. You will be thanking Him all year long for delivering you out of darkness into the light and revealing to you your eternal destiny.

#### **Principles of Hermeneutics to Accurately Interpret Scripture**

Jesus said, "When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all truth. He will not speak onhis own but will tell you what he has heard. He will tell you about the future." (John 16:13 NLT)

In addition to seeking the help of the Holy Spirit to understand the truth of God's Word, some basic principles of biblical interpretation and practice may help. Even if you have studied at a theological seminary or Bible school, you may be challenged with understanding some passages. Hermeneutics is a methodical system for interpreting the Bible as you continue to read through the Bible every year.

## It is vital to continually read through the Bible, both the Old and New Testaments, as we do every yearusing this BibleGuide.

Jesus said, "Don't misunderstand why I have come. I did not come to abolish the law of Moses or the writings of the prophets. No, I came to accomplish their purpose. I tell you the truth, until heaven and earthdisappear, not even the smallest detail of God's law will disappear until its purpose is achieved. So if you ignore the least commandment and teach others to do the same, you will be called the least in the Kingdomof Heaven. But anyone who obeys God's laws and teaches them will be called great in the Kingdom of Heaven" (Matthew 5:17-19 NLT).

**Christocentric Principle**. Jesus Christ is God and the central Person of the entire Bible. Nothing in Scripture willcontradict this reality.

Jesus said, "You search the Scriptures because you think they give you eternal life. But the Scriptures pointto me!" (John 5:39 NLT).

Peter said to Cornelius, "He is the one all the prophets testified about, saying that everyone who believes in him will have their sins forgiven through his name" (Acts 10:43 NLT).

First Mention Principle. Look at where a topic is first mentioned in the Bible.

**Complete Mention Principle.** Everything that the Bible says about a topic should be considered to provide a fulland accurate understanding.

**Contextual Principle**. Examine where a passage appears in relation to other verses at the same location in the Bible.

Geographical, Historical and Cultural Principle. Read the passage within its true context of time, place, and people.

Covenantal Principle. Consider relevant covenants that God has made with man.

Agreement Principle. One passage of Scripture will not contradict another.

**Two or Three Witnesses Principle.** Compare and contrast the verse with other verses in the Bible to find two orthree witnesses that confirm your interpretation.

"Every matter must be established by the testimony of two or three witnesses" (2 Corinthians 13:1 NLT; see also Deuteronomy 17:6).

What is necessary to believe in order to be saved

Apostles' Creed (tradition dates this to the First Century)

"I believe in God the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth;

and in Jesus Christ

his only Son our Lord;

who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary,

suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried; he descended into hell;

the third day he rose again from the dead; he ascended into heaven,

and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead.I believe in the Holy Ghost;

the holy catholic Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins;

the resurrection of the body; and the life everlasting. Amen."

#### Nicene Creed (Council of Nicea 325 A.D.)

"We believe in one God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth, and of all things visible and invisible.

"And in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only-begotten Son of God, begotten of the Father before all worlds, God of God, Light of Light, Very God of Very God, begotten, not made, being of one substance with the Father by whom all things were made; who for us men, and for our salvation, came down from heaven, and was incarnate by the Holy Spirit of the Virgin Mary, and was made man, and was crucified also for us under Pontius Pilate. He suffered and was buried, and the third day he rose again according to the Scriptures, and ascended into heaven, and sitteth on theright hand of the Father. And he shall come again with glory to judge both the quick and the dead, whose kingdom shall have no end.

"And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of Life, who proceedeth from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and glorified, who spoke by the prophets. And we believe oneholy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the remission of sins. And we look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen."

**Background.** The Nicene Creed is the most universal Christian creed and is used by the Roman Catholic, Eastern Orthodox, Anglican Communion, and many other Protestant denominations. The name is derived from the ecumenical Council of Nicea in A.D. 325 called by Emperor Constantine I to make a clear, unified statement about Jesus' divinity, fully God and fully man, refuting the heresy of Arius of Alexander that Jesus was a created being. In the 6<sup>th</sup> century the words *"and the Son"* (Latin term *Filioque*) were added (third paragraph) to read "the Holy Spirit

. . . proceedeth from the Father and the Son."

#### Athanasian Creed (first published 633 A.D.)<sup>2</sup>

- 1. "1. Whosoever will be saved, before all things it is necessary that he hold the catholic faith;
- 2. Which faith except every one do keep whole and undefiled, without doubt he shall perish everlastingly.
- 3. And the catholic faith is this: That we worship one God in Trinity, and Trinity in Unity;
- 4. Neither confounding the persons nor dividing the substance.
- 5. For there is one person of the Father, another of the Son, and another of the Holy Spirit.

<sup>6.</sup> But the Godhead of the Father, of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit is all one, the glory equal, the majesty coeternal.

**Background.** This creed begins, "Whosoever will be saved, before all things it is necessary that he hold the catholic faith" (where "catholic faith" refers to the universal church, not the Roman Catholic Church). *Quicumque Vult* is theofficial name of this creed, which refers to those first words of the text in Latin.

The Athanasian Creed first appeared in 633 A.D. at the fourth council of Toledo. It lists the doctrines essential to salvation for all believers, with specific emphasis on the doctrines of the Trinity. It is still affirmed by the ChristianChurch today.

- All members of the Godhead—Father, Son, and Holy Ghost—are uncreated, co-eternal, and of the same substance of divinity
- Christ is fully human and fully divine, "perfect God and perfect man"
- Holy Spirit proceeded from both the Father "and the Son" (*filioque*)

Although Athanasius most likely did not write this text, it has been associated with his name because he took such astrong stand for the Trinity against the Arian heresy that denied Christ was fully man and fully God and a creature who was less than God. Athanasius was a main promoter of the Nicene Creed.

Athanasius was persecuted and repeatedly exiled until his death in 373 A.D., but he never wavered from the truth of the Trinity. His famous tombstone read simply, "*Athanasius contra mundum*"—Athanasius against the world.

#### The Westminster Shorter Catechism<sup>3</sup>

**Question 1.** What is the chief end of man? **Answer 1.** Man's chief end is to glorify God, and to enjoy Him for ever.

**Question 2.** What rule hath God given to direct us how we may glorify and enjoy Him? **Answer 2.** The Word of God, which is contained in the Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, is the only rule to direct us how we may glorify and enjoy Him.

Question 3. What do the Scriptures principally teach?

Answer 3. The Scriptures principally teach what man is to believe concerning God, and what duty God requires of man.

**Question 4.** What is God? **Answer 4.** God is a Spirit, infinite, eternal, and unchangeable, in his being, wisdom, power, holiness, justice, goodness, and truth.

**Question 5.** Are there more Gods than one? **Answer 5.** There is but one only, the living and true God.

**Question 6.** How many persons are there in the Godhead? **Answer 6.** There are three persons in the Godhead; the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one God, the same in substance, equal in power and glory.

**Question 7.** What are the decrees of God?

**Answer 7.** The decrees of God are, his eternal purpose, according to the counsel of his will, whereby, for his own glory, he hath fore-ordained whatsoever comes to pass.

Question 8. How doth God execute his decrees?

Answer 8. God executeth his decrees in the works of creation and providence.

**Question 9.** What is the work of creation?

**Answer 9.** The work of creation is, God's making all things of nothing, by the word of his power, in the space of six days, and all very good.

Question 10. How did God create man?

Answer 10. God created man male and female, after his own image, in knowledge, righteousness, and holiness, withdominion over the creatures.

**Question 11.** What are God's works of providence?

Answer 11. God's works of providence are, his most holy, wise, and powerful preserving and governing all hiscreatures, and all their actions.

**Question 12.** What special act of providence did God exercise toward man in the estate wherein he was created? **Answer 12.** When God had created man, he entered into a covenant of life with him, upon condition of perfect obedience; forbidding him to eat of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, upon the pain of death.

**Question 13.** Did our first parents continue in the estate wherein they were created? **Answer 13.** Our first parents, being left to the freedom of their own will, fell from the estate wherein they werecreated, by sinning against God.

**Question 14.** What is sin?

Answer 14. Sin is any want of conformity unto, or transgression of, the law of God.

**Question 15.** What was the sin whereby our first parents fell from the estate wherein they were created? **Answer 15.** The sin whereby our first parents fell from the estate wherein they were created was their eating theforbidden fruit.

Question 16. Did all mankind fall in Adam's first transgression?

Answer 16. The covenant being made with Adam, not only for himself, but for his posterity; all mankind, descending from him by ordinary generation, sinned in him, and fell with him, in his first transgression.

**Question 17.** Into what estate did the fall bring mankind? **Answer 17.** The fall brought mankind into an estate of sin and misery.

#### The Chicago Statement on Biblical Inerrancy<sup>4</sup> (Excerpt)

**1. God, who is Himself Truth** and speaks truth only, has inspired Holy Scripture in order thereby to reveal Himselfto lost mankind through Jesus Christ as Creator and Lord, Redeemer and Judge. Holy Scripture is God's witness to Himself.

**2. Holy Scripture, being God's own Word**, written by men prepared and superintended by His Spirit, is of infallible divine authority in all matters upon which it touches: it is to be believed, as God's instruction, in all that itaffirms, obeyed, as God's command, in all that it requires; embraced, as God's pledge, in all that it promises.

**3. The Holy Spirit, Scripture's divine Author**, both authenticates it to us by His inward witness and opens ourminds to understand its meaning.

**4. Being wholly and verbally God-given, Scripture is without error** or fault in all its teaching, no less in what itstates about God's acts in creation, about the events of world history, and about its own literary origins under God, than in its witness to God's saving grace in individual lives.

**5.** The authority of Scripture is inescapably impaired if this total divine inerrancy is in any way limited or disregarded, or made relative to a view of truth contrary to the Bible's own; and such lapses bring serious loss toboth the individual and the Church.


