*Implications of Problem Gambling: Sports Gambling, Clergy Interventions, Prevention Integration and Counselor Certification* offers a range of professional learning opportunities on Problem and Pathological Gambling in Kentucky. Kentucky is underserved by professionals with knowledge and skills of how to prevent and treat Problem and Pathological Gambling. With sponsorship and planning support from the Kentucky Department of Behavioral Health, Developmental and Intellectual Disabilities, the Kentucky Council on Problem Gambling (KYCPG) seeks to fulfill its mission to increase awareness of problem gambling, promote prevention and research, and advocate for the availability of treatment. Learning objectives target the diverse elements of Problem and Pathological Gambler counseling.

### **Learning Objectives and Measurements**

- ★ **Clergy, Lay Ministers and Pastoral Counselors** -- Introduce concepts and knowledge needed to understand Problem and Pathological Gambling behavior; introduce American Compulsive Gambling Counselor Certification Board (ACGCCB) requirements for Counselor/Lay Minister certification; and provide models of first-responder activities for clergy, lay ministers and pastoral counselors to address Problem and Pathological Gambling behavior. The objectives will be measured by an evaluation completed by attendees; ability to apply information obtained with individuals and congregations; and enrollment in ACGCCB certification process.
- ★ **Counseling Professionals, including psychologists, nurses, nursing home administrators, alcohol and drug counselors, social workers, licensed professional counselors, marriage and family therapists, and employee assistance professionals** -- Enhance knowledge of the impact of personal trauma on individual Problem and Pathological Gambling behavior; introduce concepts to address trauma in counseling Problem and Pathological Gamblers; and present the role sports gambling plays in gambling culture and Problem Gambling behavior. The objectives will be measured by the number of attendees who pursue Gambler Counselor Certification (CCGC); the ability to demonstrate knowledge of Problem and Pathological Gambling treatment techniques; and completion of an evaluation provided to all attendees.
- ★ **Prevention Specialists** -- Understand why Problem and Pathological Gambling prevention is essential to integrate with existing substance abuse and public health prevention efforts; be able to identify and compare various methods of integration using the CSAP strategies and application to participants' organizational work settings; and obtain tested, practical tools to use with targeted populations. The objectives will be measured by increased inclusion of Problem and Pathological Gambling prevention strategies in community outreach awareness activities; and by a completed evaluation provided to all attendees.
