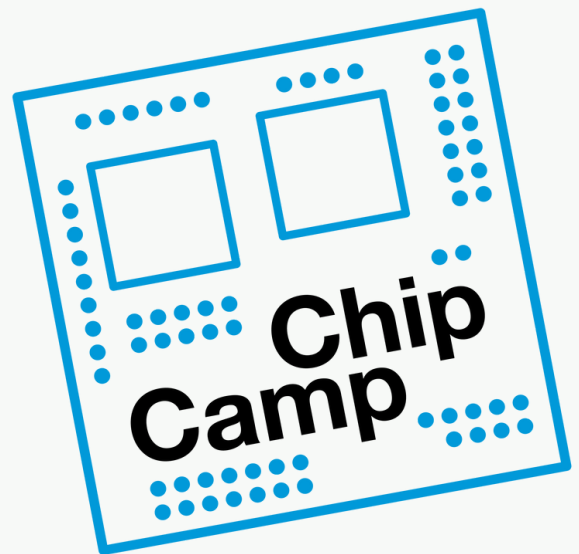

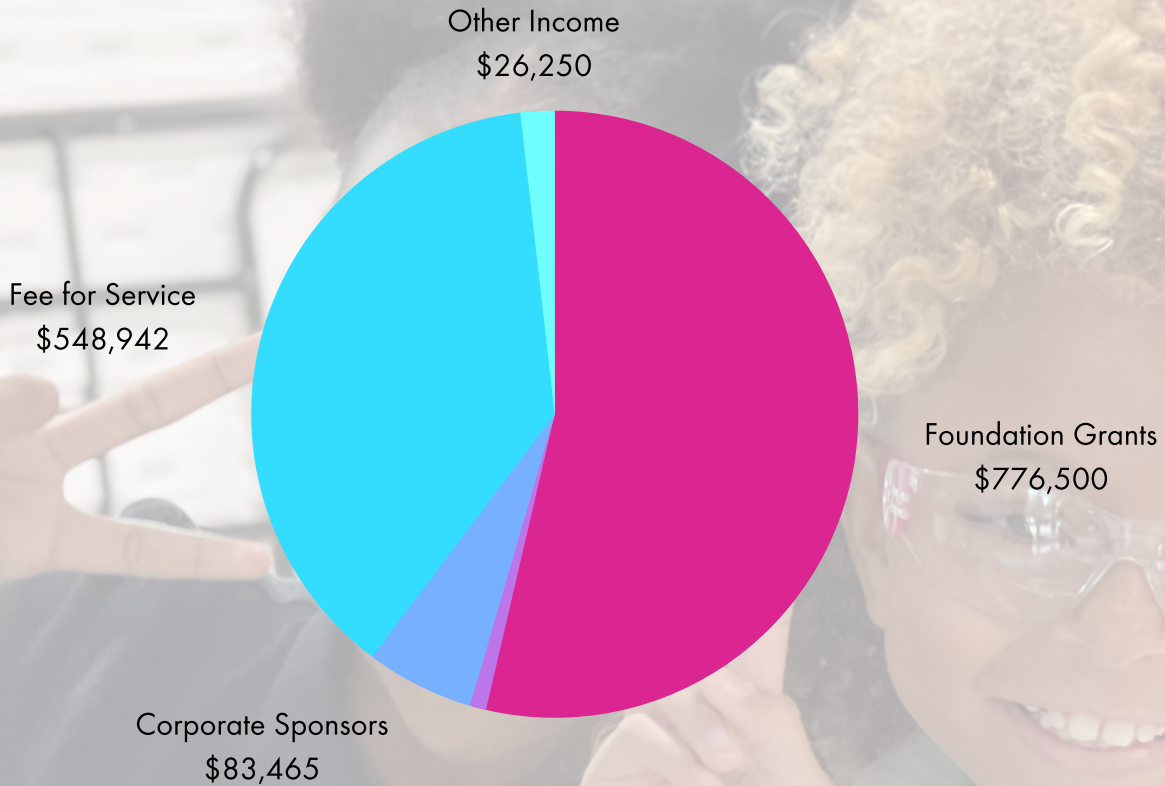

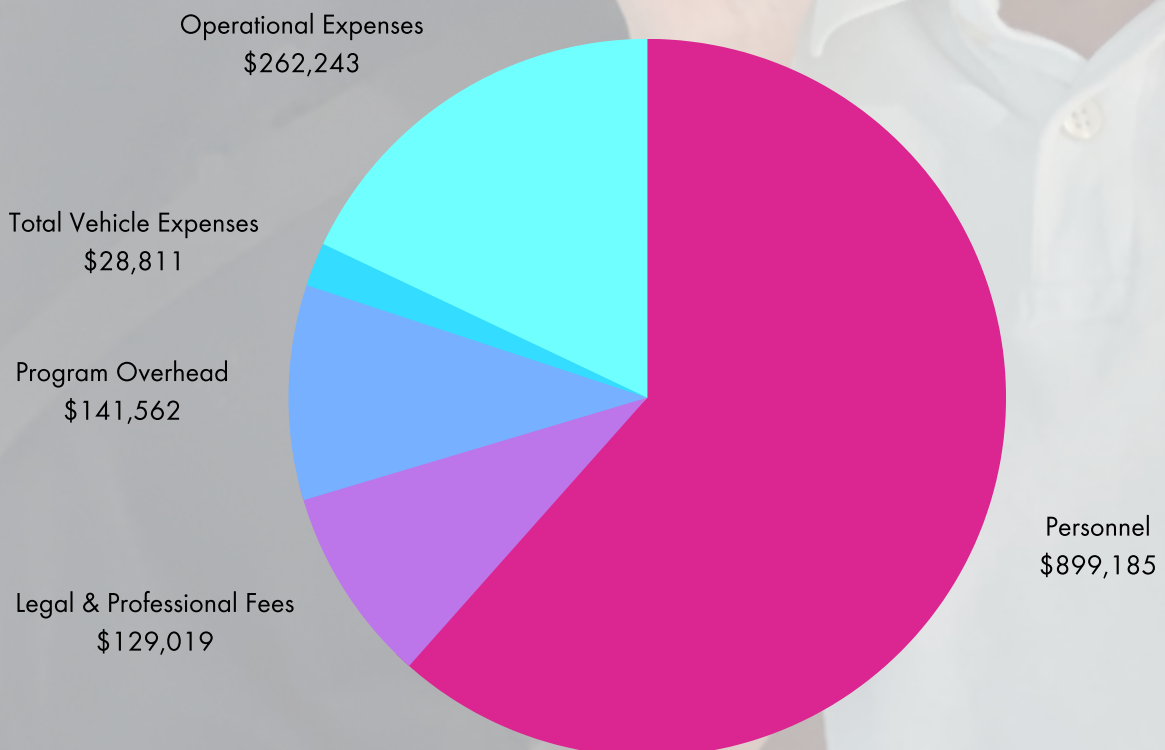


2021 STE(A)M Truck Financials
