# Tarbert and Skipness Community Trust, Minute of Board meeting held on 1<sup>st</sup> August 2017 TVH, Tarbert.

Alan welcomed Nicky Brown to the meeting. Nicky has been working with the Advisory Group.

#### **Airigh Wind Farm**

Alan introduced Nick McKay from Force 9 and Steven Park from Liberty 1 Communications to discuss the Memorandum of Understanding with proposed Airigh Wind Farm.

Airigh Wind farm project was scoped with the Scottish Government last autumn. This is a Section 36 Application because it is bigger than 50 megawatts. Application and will be with Scottish Government by August 2018 with planning decision by the end of 2018.

Questions were taken on the proposed Memorandum of Understanding (MOU).

- Appropriate community bodies will be able to invest post construction.
   Alan asked why tax would be deducted from community benefit prior to share of dividends if that community benefit was re-invested into the Trust.
  - Nick McKay will respond to Alan.
- 2. What are the multipliers on capitalising Community Benefit? Nick McKay will respond to Alan.
- 3. Tarbert act as a hub for West Kintyre and South Knapdale and could Tarbert and Skipness receive a larger percentage of community benefit by demonstrating the involvement of people from the other appropriate communities in Tarbert services and activities. Nicky is currently analysing data from the first round of community benefit dispersal and will forward this to Steven.

Nick said currently there are many uncertainties; at the point of investment many factors will need to be taken into account.

Force 9 offer £1,500 for communities that require advice at this stage. Local Energy Scotland will support communities to purchase more specific advice one planning has been agreed and the project is under way.

Nick McKay explained that there had been a request from West Kintyre Development Trust that rather than having 1 MOU combining both community benefit and ownership, it is separated into 2 separate MOUs. Nick has prepared 2 MOUs, one of which makes no reference to capitalising community benefit as a source of capital for ownership.

Alan requested a caveat in the community benefit only MOU that TSCT can use the community benefit, it does not have to be an annual allowance only. Nick and Steven were thanked for their attendance and time.
