

Assistant or Associate Professor of Music/Worship Arts

The Music Department of Toccoa Falls College invites applications for a full-time faculty position in Music/Worship Arts beginning August 1, 2017. Rank and salary are open, depending on the candidate's qualifications and experience. The department seeks someone to teach courses in worship arts and music theory, guided in part by the new professor's specializations.

Qualified candidates for the position will have completed a master's degree in music from an accredited institution at the time of appointment. Candidates with terminal degrees in music are preferred. All applicants must possess teaching experience or strong promise of excellence in the classroom and demonstrated musical proficiency. Candidates must be committed to an evangelical Christian faith and be devoted to the Christ-centered higher educational mission of the College.

This will direct candidates to submit (1) a cover letter describing interest, qualifications, and basic philosophy of teaching; (2) a personal faith narrative that interacts with TFC's statement of faith; (3) current curriculum vitae; and (4) unofficial graduate transcripts. Incomplete applications will not be processed.
