IT'S CAMP TIME!

We would like to invite your child to attend the Illinois Baptist State Association Children's Camp at Lake Sallateeska in Pinckneyville, Illinois on June 17 - 21, 2018 with us this summer. This camp is designed specifically for 3rd - 6th graders. The total cost of the camp is \$160 which includes travel, Lodging, Meals, camp activities and a t-shirt. To make this affordable for our children to attend, Logan Street Baptist Church is offering an \$80 scholarship towards the camp fee for children who attend LSBC which will leave you responsible to pay \$80 for your child to attend. We want all our children to attend this camp. If there is a financial need, please contact me, for additional scholarships are available through the church.

Enclosed you will find information about the camp, a medical release form to complete and return to the church office for registration, and a checklist as your child prepares for camp. The registration and medical form is due by Sunday, May 20th. We ask that you prayerfully consider sending your child / children to this camp with us this summer.

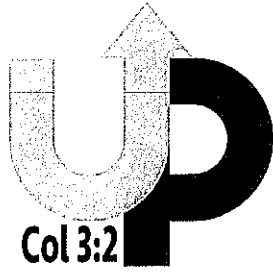

Frequently Asked Questions

– for Parents of Campers

Feel free to call Tammy Butler (217) 391-3124 or email TammyButler@IBSA.org with all of your camp questions. As a parent, we want you to be completely comfortable entrusting us with your children for summer camp 2018.

What does Summer Camp cost?

Registration is \$160 per person. This price includes lodging, meals, camp activities and a t-shirt. Registration costs are lower than most camps since our camp strategy is subsidized through gifts given by Illinois Baptist Churches through the Cooperative Program.

How do you handle refunds?

Refunds will be issued up to four weeks prior to camp. After this deadline participant requesting refunds will be offered a 50% refund due to the purchase of camp supplies.

What is the dress code?

We ask that all students and adults dress modestly. Shorts need to be longer than fingertips when arm is extended down the side of leg. No short shorts! We do NOT allow spaghetti strap tank tops or tube tops. No top should be worn where undergarments can be seen and no midriffs showing. Swimsuits should be one piece or a two-piece that covers their mid-section.

What do I need to bring to camp?

Shorts, shirts, jeans, sweater or light jacket, (hoodies are acceptable), raincoat or umbrella, tennis shoes, socks, underwear, swimsuit, sheets and blanket or sleeping bag for a twin-size bed, pillow, towels and washcloth, toiletries, flashlight, Bible, notebook, pen or Pencil.

OPTIONAL: money for snacks and items from the camp store.

What about cell phones & spending money?

Cell phones can be brought, but cell reception is not the best. However, the amount of time and when they can be used will be at the Camp Director's discretion. Lastly, campers can purchase beverages, snacks, and apparel at our General Store.

What if my child has a food allergy?

If you have a camper with a food allergy, please make sure this is noted on their 2018 Camper Information & Medical Release form. The staff will do everything possible to accommodate them and keep the kitchen staff aware of the campers' needs.

Do you have a Camp Nurse?

Yes, their primary goal is to manage the infirmary and work directly with the camp staff to ensure the safety of everyone at Camp. The camp nurse will assist in storing and administering medications as well as assessing any situation that comes up within a group.

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What time will my group arrive and leave camp?

Arrival and departure times will vary depending on which camp your child is attending. A list of camps and the specifics for each will be listed on the website.

What age ranges can attend children's camp and student camp?

Children's camp is for kids entering 3rd grade through entering 6th grade. Student camp is for students entering 7th grade through entering 12th grade.

Packing

What to Bring to Summer Camp 2018 ...and a few items to leave home

- Shorts (no short shorts)**
You will need four changes of clothes and an extra one or two. Remember, there are no laundry facilities available at the camp.
- Shirts (please no spaghetti straps or tube tops)**
Remember when you are packing that your child will receive a camp t-shirt when they arrive at camp this week. There are also shirts for sale at the camp store.
- Jeans**
One or two pairs will be sufficient. It is hot at camp!
- Sweater, Hoodie**
We realize we just shared that it is hot at camp, but this is the Midwest.
- Light jacket (in case of rain)**
We are usually blessed with nice weather but we need to be prepared.
- Socks & Underwear**
You may want to mark your clothes with your name so you can get these back home. Items like these like camp so much that they tend to hang around after everyone leaves.
- Tennis shoes & Flip Flops**
We suggest tennis shoes for most camp activities. Flip flops are great for swimming & leisure activities.
- Swimsuit**
Take note of the swim suit requirements for swim suits, we want our children to dress modestly. A big t-shirt covers most of these problems.
- Bedding (Sheets & Blanket or Sleeping Bag) and a Pillow**
Camber will be sleeping on bunk beds, so please plan accordingly.
- Towels and Washcloth**
Don't forget to also pack a swimming towel.
- Toiletries (Such as Soap, Shampoo, Toothpaste, & Deodorant)**
A small bag to store all of these items is a nice addition as well.
- Flashlight**
A small flashlight will be fine. The camps are well lit at night, kids just like having flashlights at camp.
- Bible**

We will have a few extra bibles for campers that may not have their own

Notebook & Pen or pencil

The campers will use their notebooks to take notes during the large group worship services, bible studies and evening devotions.

Medications

Please have your medications stored in their original bottle in a separate Zip lock bag to hand to the camp nurse.

Money for Snacks

The amount of money you would like to send with your child is up to you. Usually campers are fine with \$10-\$20. Check with the information sheet for your particular camp to see if there are special rules regarding snack money.

This will help you have the best camping experience ever!

Other Items
