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On behalf of our Key Ministry team and the people of Bay Presbyterian Church, we're delighted that you've set aside the time to gather with us and our other brothers and sisters in Christ called to serve His church through disability ministry. We've been incredibly encouraged by the level of interest in this year's conference. We experienced a 70% increase in speaker applications, and we're assured of setting attendance records this year - at least 60% above our figures for 2022!

When we hosted our first national disability conference (exclusively online) in 2011, one of our purposes was to provide ministry leaders with great ideas who found themselves unable to crack the conference circuit a platform for becoming "known." This year's



conference features over thirty speakers appearing here for the first time, a number of whom have publicly disclosed their disabilities.

Compared to this time last year, life in the church appears more "normal." After 37 years in the child psychiatry profession, I've come to recognize the extent to which appearances are often deceiving. Christianity - and the Christian church - has never in our lifetimes had less influence than we do now. The majority of Americans no longer attend church on a regular basis. The tidal wave of despair that began before COVID continues to build, despite the end of restrictions upon social interactions. Individuals with disabilities and their families have been disproportionately affected.

But adversity also comes with great opportunity. Historically, the Church has grown stronger at times when identifying as a Christian has been frowned upon by the authorities. The Church is at its best when we're caring for the most vulnerable among us.

In my experience working in a medical speciality that is among the most hostile to the values rooted in Scripture, in a profession rapidly abandoning any remaining tolerance for anything associated with the Church, I've seen persons inclined to reject the Gospel look up and take notice when they see

- · churches offering respite care to families of kids with disabilities, or
- Christians providing foster and adoptive homes for kids who struggle with self-control due to the cumulative effects of trauma, or
- Christian business leaders starting businesses that provide meaningful and productive work for adults with intellectual or developmental disabilities, and
- churches providing mental health and substance abuse recovery support to the quarter of our population who needs such support.

If the church in North America is ever going to reverse the increasingly negative perceptions regarding Christianity, you're the folks who will be leading the way. You are the church at its² best! Our team hopes this weekend will be one in which you'll find tools to expand the impact of your ministries for the Kingdom, along with a bunch of new friends for the journey.

One of Key Ministry's operating principles is to draw attention to like-minded ministry leaders and organizations doing exceptional work to advance the cause of individuals and families impacted by disability in the church. The President's Award was established in 2019 to recognize leaders serving in disability ministry whose work reflects the qualities the Apostle Paul describes in Philippians 4:8 – leaders through whom the works of God are unmistakably on display. Our 2023 President's Award recipient is Dr. Erik Carter.

Dr. Carter recently assumed the Luther Sweet Endowed Chair in Disabilities at Baylor University and Executive Director of the Baylor Center on Developmental Disabilities after spending a number of years on faculty at Vanderbilt's University. He has been the principal, co-author or contributing author on nearly fifty books and hundreds of journal articles about disabilities. Woven within his focus on books and articles for educators have been many journal articles and other publications devoted to practical theology, church life and spiritual growth for individuals and families with disabilities. His research on principle-driven strategies for promoting full participation, belonging, and valued roles for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in the church is world-class and supports not just his own personal advocacy, but the work that all of us in on calling, equipping, and supporting churches to be places of deep embrace and contribution for individuals with IDD and their families.

Our team at Key Ministry is grateful for Dr. Carter's work and is honored to present him with the 2023 President's Award.



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
