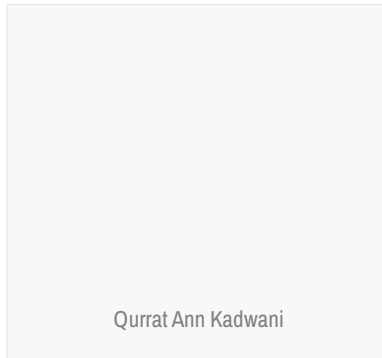


They Call Me Q is Relatable

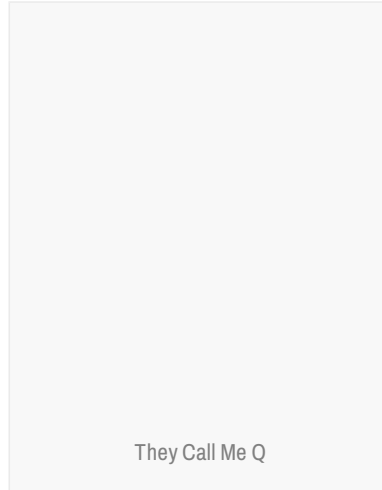
