How can we describe the breadth of the settlement house network?

This survey, performed every few years, provides information about UNH members' **staffing, funding, programs, and participants.**

The results provide a detailed picture of the UNH network, which is useful for **program, advocacy, and fund development** purposes for UNH and its members.

Late 2013: UNH engaged with High Impact Partnering, a consulting firm

March 2014: UNH finishes survey collection

November 2013: UNH members began completing the new online survey

Summer 2014: High Impact Partnering prepares preliminary report

High Impact Partnering helped revise the 2010 Member Survey, implemented a new online version of the survey, analyzed the resulting data, and prepared a detailed report and summary.

After the 2010 Survey, we learned that the UNH network consisted of: Over 400 program sites, close to 10,000 full-year staff, about 7,500 volunteers, an aggregate budget of \$500 million, and a half million program participants served.

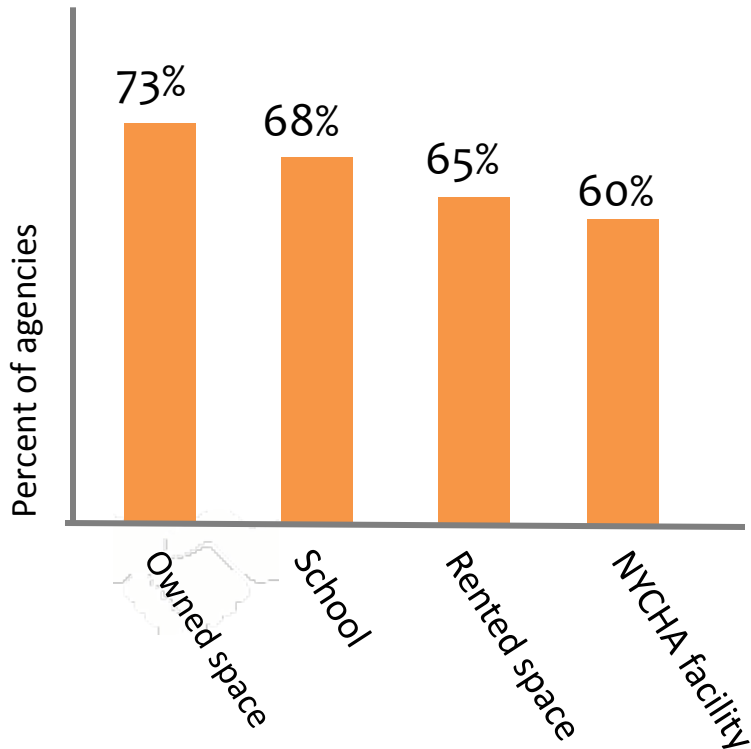

National data shows that among Generation X'ers, volunteering has increased nearly 5.5 percentage points over the last decade – a larger increase than any other population group.

On average, each agency has 14 administrative and service delivery locations.

62 CAMBA has 62 different program sites, the highest in the UNH network.

UNH member agencies operate in all 5 boroughs.

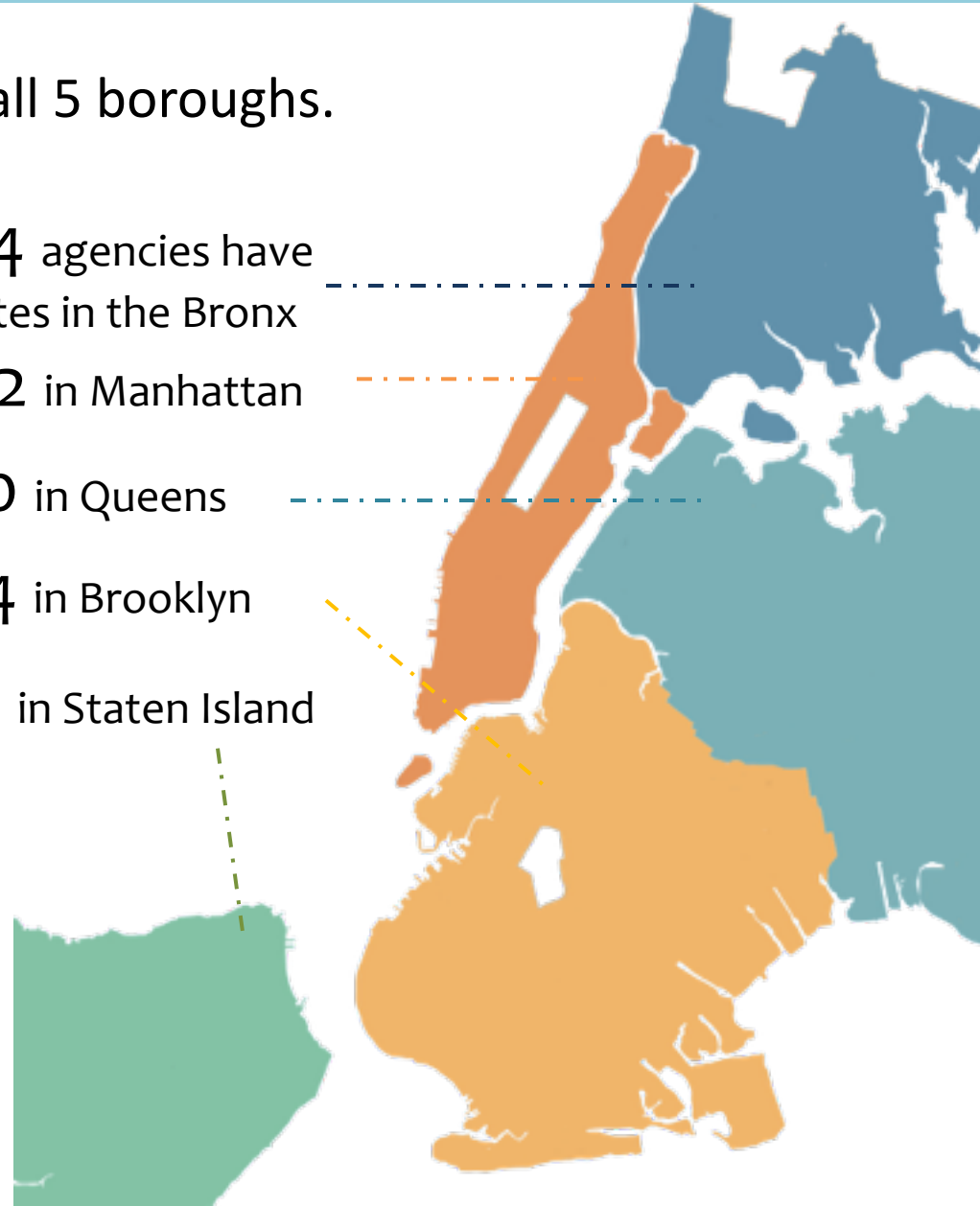

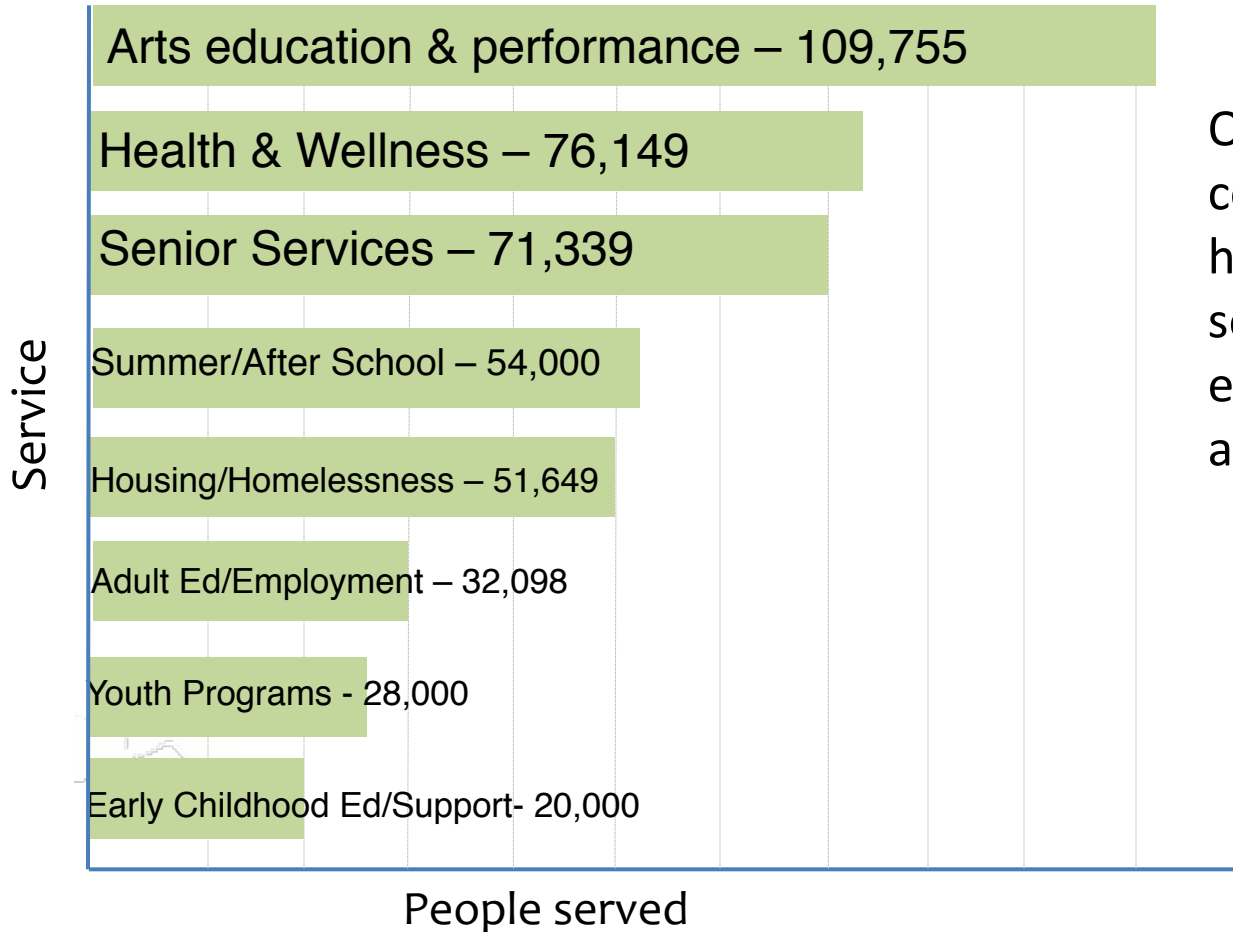

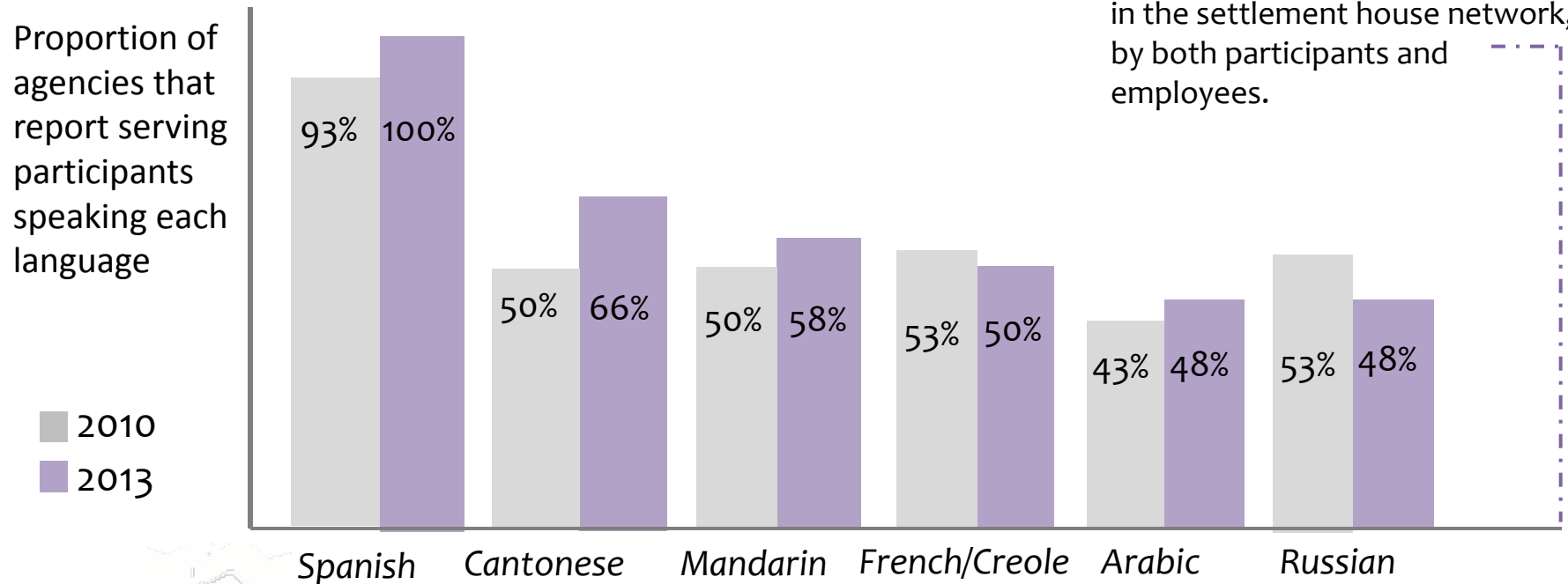

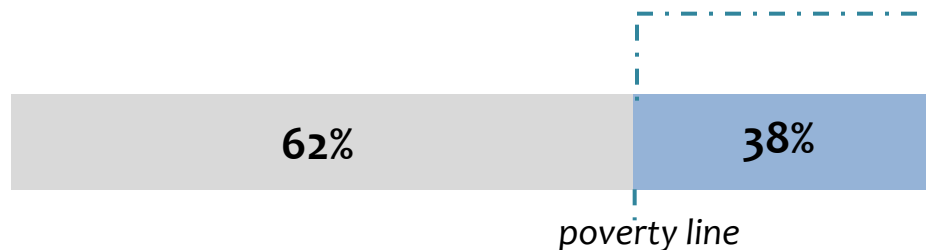
26 settlement houses in the network offer all three. Of those, 24 also offer early childhood education and family support.

Over **20** languages are represented in the settlement house network, by both participants and employees.



On average, 62% of settlement house participants are living below the poverty line.



To live below the federal poverty line, a family of four must make less than \$23,850.

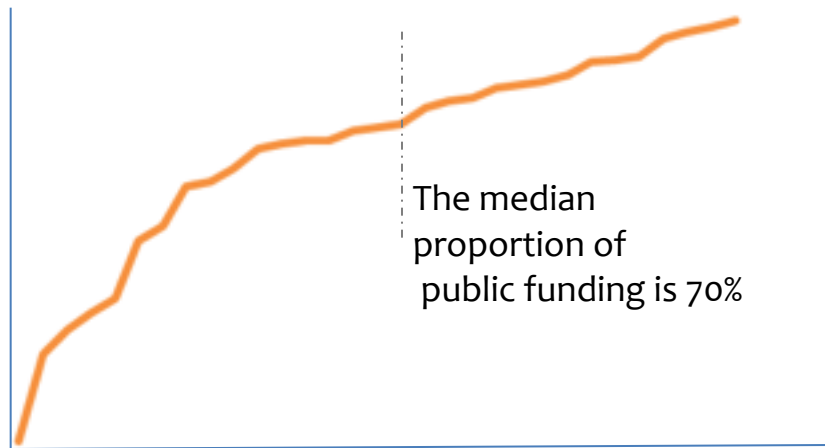
Settlement houses have diverse budget sizes and funding streams.

\$824,000 to \$110,000,000

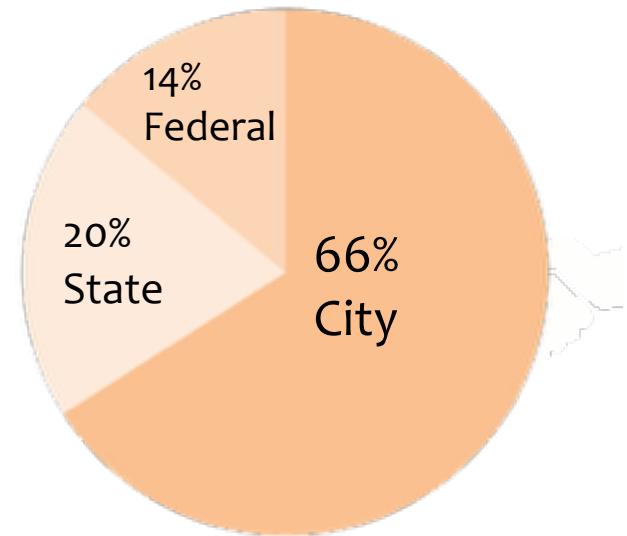


Public Funding

Average breakdown of public funding:



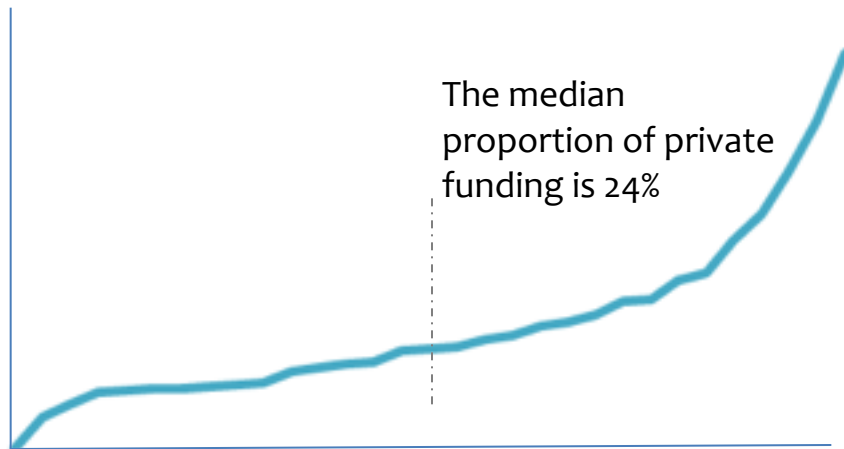
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Private Funding

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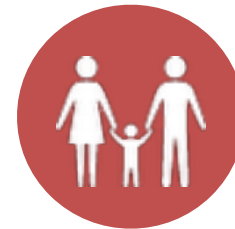
