Grazing on Grace

“Take up your cross and follow me.”

~ Jesus



We are in a new era in American culture. The era of “busy-ness.” It is a time when economy demands that both parents work to make a living; when there are endless hours of homework assigned to students; when demands to meet certain expectations have never been higher; when families work hard and play hard together because they have to take advantage of every waking moment to fit it all in. Then the church laments and wonders why Sunday morning attendance is down – it is because our families are exhausted and often simply can’t take another step to pull everyone into the church. Add to that the

era of sports and traveling ball and things get even more complicated with families on the road for about 9 week-ends of the year.

The Apostle Paul said he became all things for all people so that he might introduce them to Christ. That got several of us in our Davidson Missional Network to thinking: How can we, the Church, be all things to all people? First, we decided we could take the Church TO the ballfields instead of demanding that families give up ball to come to church.

On March 22, 2015 a group supported by Mt. Olivet UMC and Center UMC in Welcome held our first worship service at the Welcome Ball Fields for a baseball tournament sponsored by Jeremy Mabe’s team. They wanted to be very intentional about offering a time of worship on Sunday morning. At 11 a.m., Rev. Eddie Evans, Associate Pastor at Center gathered around 100 folks together on a ball field and had our first worship service provided by “Traveling Christians” – our ministry to traveling ball teams. We had an order of worship and even an altar complete with battery operated candle (so the light of Christ can’t be blown out by the wind) and a handmade cross, provided by Pat Craver. As Rev. Eddie let the service he would ask kids questions about Moses, as the sermon that day featured a story about him. If a child answered correctly, Rev. Eddie gave them a baseball as a reward. However, he only had 3 baseballs to give away.

At the front was a little boy who very much wanted one of those baseballs but he wasn’t able to answer any of the questions. After the service he approached Rev. Eddie and expressed his frustration at not winning a baseball. Rev. Eddie said he was very sorry, but maybe next time. The young man had another option, however. He carefully eyed the altar and said, “It’s ok, what I’d really like to have is that cross.” Rev. Eddie promptly handed over the altar cross and sent the young man away very happy.

Why is this ministry to busy, traveling families important? Because around 100 people were drawn together in God’s presence that morning that otherwise would have missed that opportunity. Why is this ministry important? Because, after only one service, one young man has already learned to desire the cross above all else.

I pray we keep Pat Craver busy making crosses as more and more young folks decide they too want to take Jesus home with them. If you are interested in being a part of this ministry. The United Methodist Church: Itinerate and Interesting

It is the spring of the year and for the United Methodist Church that means one thing –Pastoral Moves! In the UM Church we operate under an itinerate system, which means two things: 1. UMC pastors are appointed by a conference cabinet rather than chosen by a church and 2. UMC pastors are appointed only one year at a time. Each spring the WNCC Cabinet prayerfully agonizes over each church and each pastor, evaluating who is in the right pastorate and who they feel might be better served by a different pastorate.

I am pleased to announce that I received my letter confirming my re-appointment to serve Mt. Olivet UMC for another year. I am excited about the year ahead as I see God working through our church in so many amazing ways. I am humbled and honored to be your pastor at such a glorious time as this.

While I am remaining at Mt. Olivet there is still a big change coming for my family. As you know, my husband is also a United Methodist pastor and naturally he works under the same itinerate system from which I operate. We have received the official report that my husband, Rev. Tim Ronberts, will be leaving his pastorate at Sunrise UMC and will be appointed as the pastor of Yadkinville UMC. We are thankful for the five exciting years he has served at Sunrise but we also look forward to a very different and new ministry opportunity with the folks in Yadkinville.

After much prayerful thought and consideration, Tim and I have made the decision that it will be best for us to move our primary residence to the parsonage of Yadkinville UMC. Our move will not take place until July. Please be assured that I am doing all I can to minimize the impact this will have on you as a congregation. I will be working the details out with the Trustees but my hope is that my office will remain at the parsonage as well as the ability to reside there a few nights a week so that I can be fully present for you when needed.

Tim and I are so honored to serve Christ as United Methodist pastors and we thank you, Mt. Olivet UMC, for being such a wonderful congregation to walk with us on this journey.

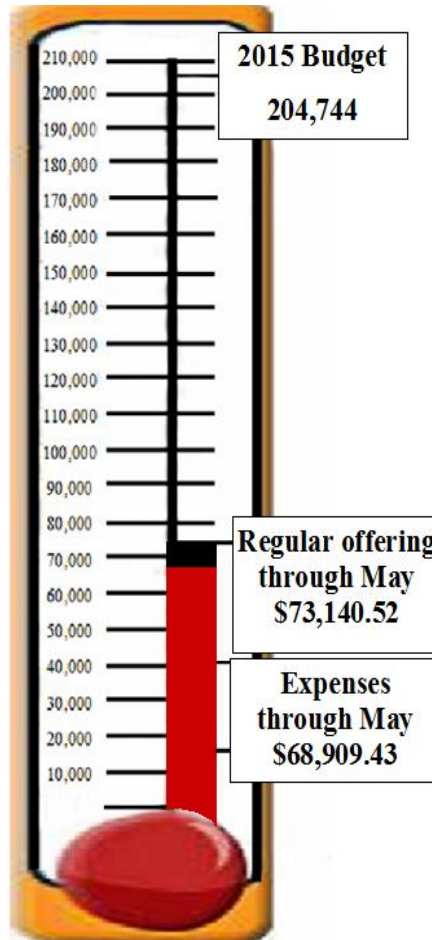
In Sunday School we averaged 102 in April and 106 in May. In worship we averaged 157 in April and 163 in May.

Our regular offerings for April were \$16,707.68, which is wonderful ! This exceeded our March offerings of \$16,342.57, and we had 5 Sundays in March. With



expenses of \$14,010.67, which included a fuel bill of \$1,166.73, we had a surplus of \$2,697.01 for the second month in a row. Praise God for His Blessings! For the Year Ending April 30, 2015, our Total Offerings were \$59,572.00 and Total Expenses were \$54,849.90, for a surplus of \$4,722.10. What a Blessing.

Also in April, we had several other offerings which were not included in the above. On April 26,

\$1,290.50 was donated to the Gideons International. Lenten Offerings of \$1,836.18 were made, and \$10,000 was donated to the Fellowship Hall Flooring Fund by some generous donors

Our regular offerings in May were down substantially from April. Even though we had 5 Sundays in May, our offerings were only \$13,568.52 compared to \$16,707.68 in April. With relatively low expenses of \$14,059.53, our loss was (\$491.01) for the month.

For the year, our Total Offerings are \$73,140.52 and Total Expenses are \$68,909.43, for a surplus of \$4,231.09. This surplus will disappear next month when we pay an unfunded expense for our new Fellowship Hall floor of over \$6,000.

If you were unable to contribute to our offerings for May due to an absence from church, please consider an increased offering for June so that we can cover our anticipated expenses. As always, thanks to those who have given so generously!

Getting What We Pray For

A mother sent her fifth grade boy to bed. After a few minutes, she went upstairs to make sure that he was getting ready for bed. When she stuck her head into his room, she saw that he was kneeling beside his bed in prayer. Pausing to listen to his prayers, she heard her son praying over and over again. "Let it be Tokyo! Please dear God, let it be Tokyo!"

When he finished his prayers, she asked him, "What did you mean, 'Let it be Tokyo'?"

"Oh," the boy said with embarrassment, "we had our geography exam today and I was praying that God would make Tokyo the capital of France."

Prayer is not a magical means by which we get God to do what we want. While God desires that we bring our petitions to Him, He has not promised to give us everything that our heart desires. In fact, if an earthly father were to do that to a child ("Oh, you want to touch the hot stove? Go ahead!"), we would consider that father guilty of child abuse. We realize that a godly father sorts through the needs and the wants of his child and ultimately decides to give his child what is in his best interest and what will bring that child the most happiness in the long run.








William Temple was right when he said, "'We do not pray in order to change his will, but to bring our own wills into harmony with his.'" As we make our requests to God, we remain open to the idea that God may have something better in mind for us. His purpose may be fulfilled in our lives in a way we cannot even imagine. So, if we pray we ought, we come away feeling blessed, knowing that God has received our petition, but confident that if God knows a better path for our lives, He will lead us in that direction.
