To date, SIBF members have contributed \$67,938 in 2017 (4 Members)

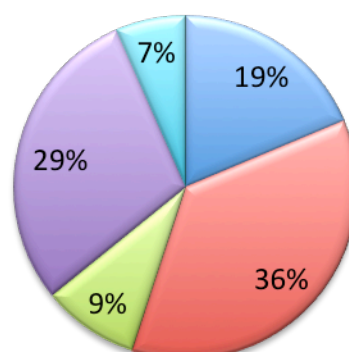
MELA Master Class:
