Mt. Pleasant Mayor, Will Haynie

Born in Greenville, South Carolina, Mayor Haynie moved with his family to Mount Pleasant in 1966. He attended kindergarten at First Presbyterian Church and spend days playing in the Old Village



and walking to Pitt Street Pharmacy for their legendary Cherry Cokes. After his father finished a stint at MUSC, Will's family moved to Sumter, SC, in 1969, where he completed high school.

Mayor Haynie graduated from The Citadel in 1983 with a degree in Business Administration. While a cadet, he rose to the highest cadet rank, regimental commander, was elected by his classmates as Commander of the Summerall Guards and received the highest award for leadership and principle that can be conferred by the college on a cadet, the Palmetto Medal Award.

In his professional life, Mayor Haynie has been CEO of several non-profits, including the Lowcountry Open Land Trust and the South Carolina Maritime Foundation. His media experience includes op-ed newspaper columnist for three newspapers including the *Moultrie News*, sailing columnist for the *Post & Courier*, talk radio show host, and a congressional press secretary. His first book was published in 2001. Mayor Haynie currently owns his own media/marketing/PR advisory firm located in Mount Pleasant.

Mayor Haynie is married to Suzette Byrd Haynie, a teacher at Jennie Moore Elementary School in Mount Pleasant. He and his wife have four children.



"EVERY ROTARIAN AN EXAMPLE TO YOUTH"

In much of the official literature of Rotary International relating to service to young people, a special slogan will be found -"Every Rotarian an Example to Youth." These words were adopted in 1949 by the Rotary International Board of Directors as an expression of commitment to children and youth in each community in which Rotary clubs exist. Serving young people has long been an important part of the Rotary program. Youth service projects take many forms around the world. Rotarians sponsor Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, athletic teams, handicapped children's centers, school safety patrols, summer camps, recreation areas, safe driving clinics, county fairs, child care centers and children's hospitals. Many clubs provide vocational counseling, establish youth employment program and promote use of The 4 -Way Test. Increasingly, drug and alcohol abuse prevention projects are being supported by Rotarians.

In every instance, Rotarians have an opportunity to be role model for the young men and women of their community. One learns to serve by observing others. As our youth grow to become adult leaders, it is hoped each will achieve that same desire and spirit to serve future generations of children and youth.

The slogan accepted over 40 years ago is just as vital today. It is a very thoughtful challenge, "Every Rotarian an Example to Youth."
