The *Pat II* was restored by a small army of volunteers at the Finger Lakes Boating Museum over seven years. It is now U.S. Coast Guard-certified and one of the few all-electric passenger vessels in the country.

This show will be among our best and we *really* look forward to seeing you.



To Antique and Classic Boating Enthusiasts Everywhere:

The Finger Lakes Chapter invites you to the **In-Person** 43rd Annual Antique and Classic Boat Show in Skaneateles, NY. The show is set at the north end of beautiful Skaneateles Lake in the village's shore-side Clift Park. This is a judged event with awards in several categories following the ACBS Two-Track Judging System.

This year, for obvious reasons, exhibitors and visitors are requested to be flexible. Due to the pandemic, we will be asking everyone to appropriately social distance and wear masks. Specific guidelines for this event will be posted at the show. As well, due to these circumstances, menus, venues and schedules are subject to change. **Remember, it is important to get your registrations in early. Reservations will be honored on a first-come, first-served basis.**

Custom-designed docks accommodate 38 boats with secure tie-downs. A land display area is in the park. The capacity of land-displays is not yet determined for the 2021 show. Tree-shaded lawns provide a perfect setting for displays of watercraft and nautical exhibits.

Two miles south of the village, on the west side of the lake, is an excellent state-owned ramp (no fee). FLC crews stand by to assist with the launch and reloading processes, although the traditional practice of valet parking of trailers and vehicles may not be possible. Further details will be forthcoming, however you may need to supply an extra driver. Parking at the launch site is somewhat limited.

Skaneateles is a historic village founded in 1833. It boasts excellent restaurants, enticing boutiques and shops, and beautifully restored and maintained homes on tree-lined streets.

Pat II's Return to Skaneateles Lake in 2021

After a seven-year restoration in the Finger Lakes Boating Museum shops, the *Pat II* will make a special visit to Skaneateles for the FLC show, but will have its permanent home in Hammondsport. The "Pat" served as the mailboat on the lake for 35 years. This year marks the first time it has been in the water since 1991.

Originally built in 1924 in Alexandria Bay as a Thousand Islands tour boat, the 39-foot launch was bought in 1955 by Don Stinson (Stinson Boat Lines) for use on this 16 mile long lake. Every summer, it delivered mail to lakeside residents and operated as a tour and dinner boat for Stinson and later, Mid-Lakes Navigation. After it was retired 30 years ago, ownership transferred a number of times before it was acquired by the museum with restoration starting in 2014.



Shipwrights supervised a group of volunteers at the museum's shop in Hammondsport. The boat has been updated to exacting safety standards without compromising the vessel's appearance, meeting modern U.S. Coast Guard specifications. The "Pat" is now all-electric and certified for 16 passengers. It will be based in Hammondsport and used to broaden the museum's presence as a cruise vessel and teaching tool.

The Skaneateles Antique and Classic Boat Show Committee is very grateful to Ben and Bill Eberhardt, who have offered the use of the Mid-Lakes dock for mooring Pat II during her highly anticipated return to Skaneateles Lake. Your hospitality, flexibility and enthusiasm will ensure a wonderful weekend for the Pat II, her dedicated crew and all who come to enjoy the show. Thank you, Mid-Lakes!

Important Notices to Mariners

Brianna's Law is in effect in New York State. Operators over a certain age must have a **Boater Safety Certificate** in order to operate a motorized vessel on NYS waters. Certificates issued by the Office of Parks and Recreation, Power Squadron, U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary and others are acceptable as well as out of state certificates. Commercial licenses issued by NYS, other states or the Coast Guard are also recognized. More information can be found at the state website: www.parks.ny.gov/recreation/boating/education.aspx. FLC and ACBS are not liable for any boater not having the proper certification.

Complimentary Vessel Safety Checks will be offered at the show again this year by the U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Flotilla 2-14 of Brewerton. Results of the check are only shared with the owner and are without liability. These checks are free and help ensure the proper safety equipment onboard. (The auxiliary is not a law-enforcement agency.)

Boat Parade and Fly-By Participants must attend a safety meeting at 2:00 pm on Saturday (July 24). The purpose is to ensure safety and proper order while allowing the dock crew to assist in an orderly manner. The routes of both the parade, the subsequent fly-by and Sunday's "photo shoot" will be discussed.

ACBS Boat and Motor Classifications source: ACBS 2021 Directory, page xvii

Historic: A boat or motor built up to and including 1918

Antique: A boat or motor built between 1919 and 1942

Classic: A boat or motor built between 1943 and 1978, inclusive

Late Classic: A boat built after 1978 through the year 25 years prior to the current year (1978-2004)

Contemporary: Any wooden boat built in the past 25 years.

Judging Categories

The Boat Show is a judged event with awards in the three judging categories shown below (**Preserved Boats, Restored Boats** and **Other**). Wooden boats being judged in the Preserved category should be high-scoring boats with at least 60% of the original deck and topside wood remaining. In addition, any restoration work must have been done using the same methods as the original builder. Restored boats are those with less originality. A relatively new award is the "Best in Show, Non-Wood," which may be won by an entry in either the Preserved or Restored category. The judges, using information supplied by the owner and the ACBS Judging Guidelines, will ultimately confirm the proper category for an entry being judged. Marque Club Awards will be awarded to outstanding examples of Century, Chris Craft, Gar Wood, Hacker Craft and Lyman boats and determined by the judges.

Judging Agreement

While boats and motors are being judged, the owners are encouraged to be present.

By registering a boat to be judged, the owner explicitly grants permission for judges to board the boat as may be needed to properly carry out the judging process, even if the owner is not present.

Judges are experienced in such matters and exercise care in examining a boat or motor being judged.

Saturday Evening Banquet & Awards Ceremony

A cash bar with steamed clams (available during cocktail hour) will open from 5:30—6:30 pm. An elegant meal will be served at your table by the Sherwood Inn. Be sure to note your menu preference on the Reservation form. Following dinner will be the annual Awards Ceremony of the judged displays and boats. Exhibitors, their guests, boat show sponsors, local dignitaries and Finger Lakes Chapter members will be in attendance. Any restrictions in place at the time of the show may result in reduced seating or even a location change. Changes will be posted and announced at the show.

Sunday Morning Breakfast

This will be “on your own.” There are a number of breakfast opportunities within walking distance including: the Sherwood Inn, The Patisserie, Johnny Angel's and the Skaneateles Bakery.

Sunday Morning Photo-Shoot & Spectator Cruise

A perfect action view of the antique boats will be available from the decks of the *Judge Ben Wiles*. This is also just plain fun to watch without a camera! The boat leaves the dock at 10:00 on Sunday morning for a one-hour cruise on the lake. The *Judge* will make a slow tour of the north end of the lake while exhibitors navigate in random passes, close abeam. The fare is \$15.00 for adults and \$5.00 for children under 13 (accompanied by an adult). Reserve by calling Mid-Lakes at 315-685-8500, online at www.midlakesnav.com or pay onboard. The *Judge* needs 20 passengers to sail.

Music in the Park

Music in the park begins at noon. The People's Choice Award will be announced in early afternoon and the raffle drawings will be pulled just before the show closes at 2:00pm. Following the show, assistance will be available at the launch ramp.

Deadlines

- 1) Completed **Registration Forms** should be returned with payment no later than **July 14**. Registrations received after this date may not be eligible for the show due to COVID regulations. On-site payments will be credit card only. Capacity throughout the event will be firm. Registrations will be honored in the order received.
- 2) To have the history/story of your boat considered for publication in the official boat show program, it must be received by **May 10**, and accompanied by completed registration and reservation forms with appropriate payments. Please include a photo of the boat.
- 3) Entries received after **July 15** will be welcomed on a space-available basis. They will, however, be eligible for judging solely at the discretion of the Chief Judge.
- 4) Adjustments to the number of meal reservations (increases or refunds) can be accommodated up to one full week before the start of the boat show (**Friday, July 16**).

Please Note:

Commercial Transactions and “For Sale” Signs Are NOT Allowed at the Boat Show

A local ordinance prohibits commercial (for profit) transactions in Clift Park. The use of “For Sale” signs on boats, motors or displays in the Boat Show area is prohibited. However, a bulletin board will be at the Registration Tent where items for sale may be posted.
