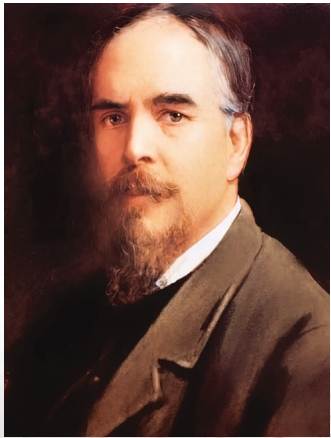

The Ballance House is the birthplace of John Ballance (1839-93) the highly regarded Premier of New Zealand who founded NZ's great reforming Liberal party and ensured that women could vote, a world first, 25 years before the UK.

Known as a friend of the Maori, Ballance played a pivotal constitutional role in the evolution of NZ and, through spectacularly successful economic policies, gave NZ the self-confidence to believe in its future as a nation.



'Half a World Away from Here, Our New Zealand Story' exhibition

Explore the special relationships that exist between Northern Ireland and New Zealand.

- Find out about the extraordinary contributions many Ulster people made to NZ, such as prime minister Bill Massey, school founder John Dilworth, and business-women Mary Jane Milne and Marianne Smith.
- View unusual carved Maori artefacts including tools, weapons and jewellery, and images of the first people to discover and live in Aotearoa (NZ).
- Go back in time as you step into the Victorian Parlour, the 'good room' of our great grandparents in rural Ulster.
- View the outdoor collection of preserved Victorian farm machinery once used on local farms.
