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SUMMERLANDS: LANDSCAPE PAINTINGS
Works from the Noyes Museum of Art Collection



GALLOWAY, NJ – The Noyes Museum of Art of Stockton University presents *Summerlands: Works from the Noyes Permanent Collection* from May 5 – August 28, 2016 at the Noyes Gallery at Stockton's Seaview Resort. The exhibition showcases works from the permanent collection of South Jersey's own Noyes Museum. Celebrating the delights of the summer landscape, the work of five artists is featured: David Ahlsted, Joan Arbeiter, Robert Evans, Richard Kemble, and Glen Rudderow. David Ahlsted: Originally from Minnesota, Ahlsted has lived, worked, and exhibited his work in New Jersey since 1971. Tending towards realism, he reveals the beauty hidden in the ordinary. A professor emeritus at Stockton University, his four murals

Pine Barrens grace the walls of Campus Center. He has also Skidmore College and his alma where he earned his MFA.

Joan Arbeiter: In her bucolic *Vanishing Vista* series, scenes of verdant farm and forest landscapes serve as backdrops for essays describing threats to nature. These essays, detailing the technical aspects of various environmental contaminants, waft around the canvas like smoke. Joan Arbeiter states, "My work and statement express my concerns for environmental balance and the special qualities of place."

Robert Evans: Concerning himself with creating beautiful and richly painted images bordering on the surreal, Evans hints at a history under the surface while maintaining a sense of mystery. An artist and independent curator, he is based close to Wrightsville, PA. Evans' work can be found in many public collections including the Metropolitan Museum of Art; National Gallery of Art; and Corcoran Museum of Art.

Richard Kemble: Making woodblock prints using forms made from plywood or masonite, Kemble printed on Japanese rice paper, creating compositions playing with the textures and colors of nature. He was inspired by the shore landscapes surrounding his homes in Nantucket and Key West. Kemble stated "I believe that my successful works are imbued with some kind of spirituality which transcends my ability to verbalize."

Glen Rudderow: A Noyes Museum Signature Artist, Rudderow has been a painter for almost as long as he can remember. A plein-air painter, Rudderow treks into the great outdoors with his easel and paint box anywhere from Stow Creek all the way down to the Maurice River to create sensitive and skilled representations of South Jersey's natural landscapes.

The Noyes Museum of Art was founded in Oceanville, NJ in 1983 to collect, preserve, and exhibit American fine and folk art, with an emphasis on New Jersey artists and folk art forms, reflecting the area's traditions, history, landscape, and culture.
