1817 TOUR OF THE NORTHERN STATES

On Sunday, June 1, 1817, just three months after his inauguration as fifth president, fifty-nine year old James Monroe and a small entourage embarked on a tour of the northern states with two critical goals: inspection of military defenses and national unity.

The tour included stops in Zanesville and Putnam August 30-31, 1817.

For years **Dennis Bigelow** has served as the costumed Monroe interpreter at Ash Lawn-Highland, next to Monticello. Jefferson asked Monroe to lay the cornerstone of the University of Virginia at nearby Charlottesville on grounds once owned by Monroe and adjacent to Dennis Bigelow's own birthplace.
