Topic: International Collaboration in Fighting Corruption

The Economic and Social Council,

Concerned about the seriousness of problems and threats posed by corruption to the stability and security of societies, which undermine the institutions and values of democracy and justice and jeopardize the rule of law, our countries realize that the problem of corruption is a matter of primary importance,

Alarmed with the connection between corruption and other forms of crime, and especially organized crime, and economical crime, including stealing money from governments,

Concerned by the seriousness of problems caused by corruption with threats to the stability and the security of society, which can destroy democratic institutions and ethical values and justice and make sustainable development impossible,

1. *Urgently emphasizes* the necessity to develop effective international legal documents against corruption, beside the UN Convention against Corruption to fight corruption against transnational organized crime;

2. *Recommends* to definitively overview and analyze all appropriate international documents and make recommendation as a part of preparation work for this document;

3. *Strongly encourages* education for a major part of society, for people interested in security and the political sphere and who wish to connect their future with it, which would be directed on anti-corruption programs, which would make people aware of the true situation in the world regarding this particular problem;

4. *Calls for* monitoring institutions endangered by possible corruption and organize a strict system of personnel recruitment;

5. *Approves* the creating of an online transparency system for tracking incomes of all government employers, which would be accessible by all citizens of the country;

6. *Expresses hope* that countries will encourage mass media and non-government organizations to work on the topic of corruption and share with people proper information about illegal actions connected with corruption;

7. *Recommends* a decrease in the level of bureaucracy and create online documentation systems, reducing the required documentation for civil documents;

8. *Calls for* ensuring restoration of violated rights and legitimate interests, with reparation for damages and harm caused by corruption offenses;
