Topic: International Collaboration and Partnership in Fighting Corruption

The Economic and Social Council,

Reaffirming United Nations Convention against Corruption of 31 October 2003, which encourages Governments to work with UN bodies aimed to improve prevention, international cooperation, asset recovery and develop appropriate methods of criminalization,

Noting with satisfaction the past efforts of various relevant UN bodies and nongovernmental organization,

Stressing the fact that the problem of corruption is the main obstacle for sustainable development for the countries of the United Nations,

1. *Calls upon* international training to be held by the Federal Republic of Germany, Kingdom of Belgium, France Republic, the United States of America, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland aimed to share an international experience of fighting corruption with Republic of Turkey, Ukraine, Syrian Arab Republic, the Kingdom of Saudi Arabia, Republic of Costa Rica, the Socialist Republic of Vietnam,
2. *Requests* the knowledge about decentralization and anti-corruption gained in the training be used to create or reform anti-corruption bodies in their countries
3. *Calls upon* these bodies to be monitored by experts, who have dealt with corruption in less corrupt countries,
4. *Encourages* governments from highly corrupt nations to launch anti-corruption campaigns through social advertising, educational sessions for youth, surveying, and a creation of a corruption hotline,
5. Urges governments to create an open electronic system for public and governmental sectors in order to ensure transparency of financial operations.
6. *Expects* to secure facilitation and simplification of starting and conducting small and midsized businesses throughout the world
7. *Reaffirms* the necessity of passing stricter anti-corruption laws
