

Ukraine



Ukraine is the largest country entirely located within Europe. The Kievan Rus in the ninth century was the beginning of the formation of a state and helped to form the identity of Ukrainian people. For much of Ukraine's history, the country has been a part of a bigger empire, such as the Ottoman Empire, Austria-Hungary, and the Soviet Union among others. The current state gained independence from the Soviet Union in 1991 and has been a sovereign state since. In 2014, a short revolution took place in Ukraine, where then President Viktor Yanukovich was removed from power and fled to Russia, after a series of political decisions with the aim of bringing Ukraine closer politically to Russia, and away from western Europe. Ukraine has been involved in a territorial dispute with Russia over the Crimean peninsula since 2014, when Russia annexed the territory. Nearly all of the international community continues to recognize the territory as Ukrainian. Since the annexation, conflict in the east of Ukraine has flared up and continued to present day. Ukraine has continued to pursue and make steps toward becoming more of a part of western Europe, with Ukrainian citizens no longer needing visas to visit the Schengen Area, an area comprised of twenty six countries in continental Europe, as of June 2017.
