

Positive Behaviour Support is a school-wide approach to support and teach expected student and teacher/staff behaviour. All Lakes Entrance teachers/staff and students will use the SWPBS matrix to learn and practice social behaviours that are conducive to a positive school climate. This chart is a teaching tool for the Lakes Entrance Secondary College community.

School-Wide Uniform Expectations

Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform whilst at the College, travelling to and from the College and when attending College functions.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students are expected to wear the correct school uniform. Students who are not in school uniform will be required to go home to change into their uniform. Once they are in uniform, they will be permitted at school. ● Students are allowed to wear LESC branded hats outdoors. No other hats can be visible on campus. ● Students are expected to bring the correct school uniform to participate in physical education classes. ● If a student is in partial school uniform (wearing the school shirt but incorrect pants or shoes), they will get a Uniform pass from their Year Level Coordinator prior to the commencement of classes. ● Stage 1 = Warning, Stage 2 = Parent Contact, Stage 3 = Parent Contact + Recess Detention, Stage 4 = Parent Contact, Principal lunch Detention, Stage 5 = Contact with parent. Option to go home and change. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Students who present to class and/or in the school yard out of uniform will be sent to the Year Level Coordinators' office for an out of Uniform Pass. ● YLCs record students out of uniform in Compass every time a student presents out of uniform and issue a valid pass. ● Teachers monitor student uniform compliance by asking for Uniform Passes during class time and in the school yard. ● "Uniform sweeps" will be held. ● A common-approach to dealing with students being out of uniform and the staged-response will be communicated. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● In accordance with the guidelines set by the Department of Education and Training (DET) students are expected to wear the correct school uniform at all times. ● Notes from parents will not be accepted to excuse their child from wearing the school uniform. ● The school, at its discretion, may require medical notes or parent conferences for excessive uniform passes. ● Students may receive access to the curriculum outside of the classroom or at home if they persist in presenting to school out of uniform.
