Nancy is currently serving as an Assistant Professor of Health and Physical Education at Oral Roberts University in Tulsa, OK, where she has been named Teacher of the Year in her department in 2000-2002, 2009-2010, 2012-2013 and most recently 2015-2016.

Prior to teaching at ORU, she taught at Oklahoma City University from 1991-1998 and also served as an Elementary Physical Education teacher at Coronado Elementary, in the Putnam City School District from 1981-1991. She is a member of SHAPE, and OAHPERD. She is also the Secondary Representative for the Education Department at ORU for the Health and Physical Education teacher education degree option and serves as the Student Teacher Supervisor for the Physical Education program. She has completed two Program Reviews for NCATE accreditation for the Physical Education area at ORU. One of her other duties at ORU is being a sponsor for the Majors Club in the Health and Physical Education Dept. Nancy previously served several years ago as the College elect and representative on the OAHPERD Board and Council. She also served as a Physical Activity Consultant for the Head Start Programs through AAHPERD from 2009-20012. The focus of that program was to help in the fight of childhood obesity and promote healthy living at the Head Start Centers by working in conjunction with the teachers in incorporating more physical activity for the children throughout the day. She also served on the area management team for Special Olympics in Tulsa for several years and has been a certified American Red Cross Instructor for Adult CPR and First Aid since 1998. Nancy fulfilled her undergraduate education studies at the University of Hawaii and then completed her B.S. in Education (Health and Physical Education) at the University of Central Oklahoma in 1980 (previously known as Central State University) and her Masters of Education with an emphasis on Physical Education from the University of Central Oklahoma in 1993.
