RE: Support for SB 822 (Wiener)

Dear Senator Wiener,

The undersigned startups, innovators, and entrepreneurship support organizations write to express our strong support of state legislative efforts to reinstate and reinforce net neutrality protections, including Senate Bill 822.

The FCC's December 2017 order repealing its 2015 net neutrality rules was a blow to the country's vibrant and thriving startup ecosystems. Thanks to net neutrality protections—which prohibited Internet service providers (ISPs) from blocking or slowing access to certain websites and online services, or charging those websites and services for better access to users—an entrepreneur with a good idea and an Internet connection could start and grow their company anywhere in the country. The Bay Area, while obviously a leading place for startup growth, doesn't have a monopoly on good ideas and determination, and startup ecosystems are growing across the state, from Siskiyou County to San Diego.

In the wake of the federal repeal, which will leave U.S. Internet users without meaningful net neutrality protections for the first time in a more than a decade, it is critical that states take the lead to craft their own net neutrality rules. Without net neutrality protections, startups will be at the mercy of incumbent ISPs and face insurmountable disadvantages when competing with larger, more established companies that can pay for better access to users.

Senate Bill 822 reinstates the protections in the 2015 order that prohibited blocking, throttling, and charging for better access to users, and, like the 2015 order, it ensures that ISPs can't circumvent those protections by manipulating traffic at interconnection points. The bill also bans ISPs from charging companies to exempt their websites or services from users' data caps, which unfairly tilts the online playing field towards deep-pocketed incumbents.

We urge all California state lawmakers to support Senate Bill 822 to reinstate the net neutrality protections that startups have relied on and need to continue being a driving force in California's economic and job growth.
