

Cane Ridge High School Dress Code Policy

Students can wear...

- Solid-color shirt with sleeves in purple, black, white or gray
- Solid-color t-shirts with sleeves in purple, black, white or gray
- All shirts must be appropriately buttoned; no tank tops or camisoles visible
- CRHS t-shirts and CRHS logo shirts with sleeves (Spirit wear is available for purchase)
- Solid-color cardigan in purple, black, white or gray (shirt underneath must be purple, black, white or gray or CRHS t-shirt)
- Solid-color blazer in purple, black, white or gray (shirt underneath must be purple, black, white or gray or CRHS t-shirt)
- Jackets, sweaters, windbreakers worn during the school day must be purple, black, white or gray
- Sweatshirts that are purple, black, white or gray and CRHS spirit sweatshirts
- Solid-color pants in black or khaki (black denim & khaki denim appropriate), can be bound on the ankle but cannot be fleece “sweat pant” material, no tears, holes, rips or frayed material
- Knee-length, solid-color shorts and skirts in black or khaki
- Knee-length, solid-color dress with sleeves and with collar in black or khaki

Students cannot wear...

- Hoodies (zipped or pullover)
- Any pants, denim, shorts, skirt, dress that is not black or khaki
- CRHS hoodies
- Leggings or jeggings
- Jogging pants, work-out pants, gym pants, sweats, yoga pants, pajama bottoms
- Athletic team apparel other than CRHS
- Gym, basketball or running shorts
- CRHS sweat pants or CRHS athletic shorts
- Midriff shirts
- Shirts without sleeves
- Sheer clothing (shirts, skirts or pants)
- Shorts, skirts or dresses above the knee
- Fitted, tight, spandex, stretchy skirts or dresses
- Sheer skirts, dresses with short skirt underneath or short sheer on front and long on back
- Ball caps, beanies, hats, stocking caps, ski caps, scarves, (hats will be confiscated the 3rd time asked to remove. Parents can pick up confiscated hats)
- Full head covering except for religious purposes
- Bandanas or gang related clothing
- House shoes or slippers
- Patterned apparel
- Any shirt that is not purple, black, white or gray

- Sagging pants or shorts – if student does not have belt to keep in place, student violates dress code
- Socks or any article of clothing that depicts/promotes drugs, alcohol, inappropriate sexual behavior or violence

Consequences

Dress code violation is considered a Type I offense in the MNPS student-parent handbook. For 1st violation, student will have opportunity to call parent for change of clothing. If a change of clothing is not possible, student will be assigned to the restorative classroom for the day (Formerly In-school suspension). 2nd violation includes assignments to the restorative classroom and a face-to-face parent conference at CRHS.
