ABOUT OUR SCHOOL

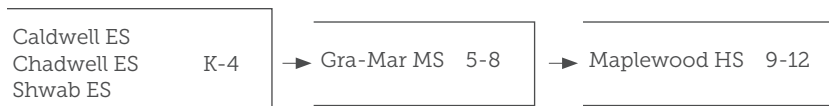
