Academic courses are taught at the honors or Advanced Placement level. Students are required to take six courses per semester and must accumulate no fewer than 22.5 credits to graduate, with a minimum of three AP credits also for graduation. Hume-Fogg offers two relatively unique advanced courses: Advanced Calculus (post-AP), and the two-year AP Capstone/Research class. We maintain a nationally recognized arts program here, including jazz, symphonic band, orchestra, visual arts, choir, theater. We also offer advanced study in German, Latin, Spanish and French.
