Hickman School is committed to frequent two-way communication with families about children's progress. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

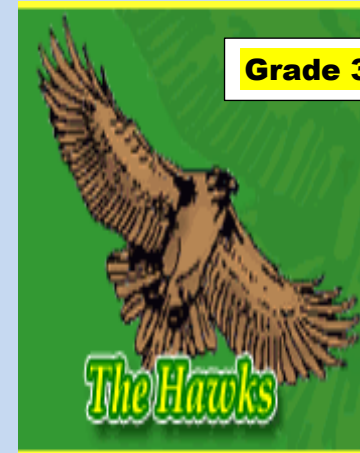

Third Grade Classroom Happenings

As a third grade teacher, I will support student learning by:

- Teaching mathematical concepts, properties, and applications of multiplication and division.
- Utilize leveled, small-group instruction to develop the grade-appropriate decoding and phonics skills required for grade-level fluency.
- Reporting students' behavior daily and provide class newsletters about events and instruction.
- Implementing the school-wide Olweus anti-bullying program.

Third Grade Parental Guidance:

In support of student learning, as a Hickman parent, I will:

- Work with my child 10-15 minutes each night to memorize multiplication and division facts.
- Read with my child nightly to improve fluency.
- Initial my child's behavior report nightly and read all school communications promptly.
- Support and reinforce the principles and practices of the Olweus anti-bullying program.
- Attend Parent trainings and events at Hickman.
