Based on:	12 children on roll at the time of the Autumn 2016 census.

Provision	Cost	Rationale	Outcomes and Impact
Subscription to Hunts Schools Sports Partnership.	£3,250	<p>The Service Level Agreement with Hunts Sports Partnership includes 5 x 6 hours of specialist PE coaching for teachers at Ermine Street. Each bespoke coaching programme will include joint planning, a demonstration lesson, team teaching and an observation of the class teacher.</p> <p>Organisation of and entry into a range of inter-school sports competitions, including tag rugby and tennis.</p> <p>Provision of an extra-curricular netball club 1 half-term).</p> <p>Training children to take on the role of lunchtime Play Leaders.</p> <p>Staff training session on approaches to the Outdoor & Adventurous element of the PE curriculum.</p>	
Appoint a Lunchtime Play Leader.	£2,179	Appointment of an additional Midday Supervisor whose role is purely to model, set up and introduce children to new games and physical activities at lunchtime. 1 hour, 5 days per week.	
Fund additional extra-curricular sports clubs.	£2803	Provision for employing a Teaching Assistant to work for 5 hours per week throughout the year to either assist or lead extra-curricular sports activities. This will enable the running of a club on every day of the school week.	
Playground markings and equipment.	£2650	Add markings and structures to the playgrounds to enhance and create new play opportunities. These will include a cricket wicket, hopscotch and numberline.	
Balance bikes for Year R and Year 1 children.	£360	Purchase 6 balance bikes. This will enable a new scheme of work to be delivered and to support children to improve their balance ahead of riding a full pedal bike. Cycling provision is current all in Key Stage 2 via the Bikeability scheme (Levels 1 and 2).	

Bikeability	£48	In order for the Level 1 training to go ahead while we have small cohorts, it is necessary for the school to partly fund this initiative. By doing so, we ensure that lower Key Stage 2 children have the opportunity to develop their cycling skills.	
Purchase additional equipment to increase PE/sports opportunities in school.	£630	We currently have enough gymnastic mats for 16 children to take part in this aspect of the curriculum. With the number of children growing we must ensure equal access for all and so this element of the funding will be used to purchase 8 additional mats and storage for them.	
Pedometers	£89.60	We will purchase a class set of pedometers. These will be assigned to a class of children for a period of time. They will be used to measure a benchmark of steps taken and how this value increases over time. We anticipate that the pedometer itself will also be a motivation.
