#### Peter Adams Design Program

Bonsai artist Peter Adams will be returning to Portland for 2008, and will again be presenting his advanced design program for interested individuals. Peter's classes are designed to assist students who are new to bonsai or advanced students who would like to advance their trees to the next level.

The first meeting for the 2008 season will be on March 8th and 9th, 2008 at the home of Keith Wingfield. Each session runs from 10:00 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. The course will continue over several months with future dates for classes being decided upon at the first class.

Student's trees will be addressed in open session, a work plan for the future development of the tree will be established, a black and white working sketch will be provided for the future design and the tree will be photographed. Peter will then generate a full color drawing for the future design of the tree and along with care and development instructions provide a complete program to the student.

At future meetings, the progress of tree will be discusses and design aspects will continue to develop within the comfortable framework for the tree. Students are welcome to bring additional trees for work or for another design program as the course progresses as part of the costs of the course.

The cost for the program is \$85.00 per day for the complete design program and \$75.00 for those who do not wish to have a full design program.

The number of participants has already increased over last year and Peter has extended his visit to accommodate additional participants. Spaces are still available for both March 8th and March 9th, but are filling quickly. The classes are limited to 7 students per session.
