## 800<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of the Dominican Order

### Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas, Rome

The Pontifical University of St. Thomas Aquinas is referred to as Angelicum because it is named in honor of its patron saint, St. Thomas Aquinas, who is known as the “Angelic Doctor.” Although it is run by the Dominican friars, today it is a pontifical university because it is directly dependent on the Pope for its status.

The Angelicum began in 1222 as a school to educate men entering the Dominican Order focused on the study and teaching of Truth. This focus continued until the mid-sixteenth century when, in light of the needs of the Church, the Angelicum became a center of theological thought not only for Dominican friars but for the Church as a whole. The Angelicum continued as a theological “think tank” and gradually evolved into a modern day center for the education of both religious and diocesan priests, such as Father Karol Wojtyla (the future St. John Paul II). In 1963, in light of the changes brought about by the Second Vatican Council, the Angelicum became a pontifical university and began educating both men and women, lay, religious, seminarians and ordained.

Today, the Angelicum continues its tradition of the study of truth in the disciplines of philosophy, theology, social science and canon law.
