## 800<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Bartolome de las Casas, O.P. (1484 – 1566) ~

Born in 1484, Bartolome de las Casas, O.P., was an intellectual, social reformer and a Dominican friar. As one of the first European settlers in the Americas, he participated in but eventually opposed the atrocities committed against the Native Americans by the Spanish colonists. In 1515, he reformed his views, gave up his holdings of land and slaves and advocated before King Charles V, Holy Roman Emperor, on behalf of the rights of the natives. In 1522, he entered the Dominican Order.

Las Casas traveled Central America undertaking peaceful evangelization among the Maya of Guatemala and participated in debates among the Mexican churchmen about how best to bring the natives to the Christian faith. He always insisted, contrary to many colonists, that they were human and worthy of baptism.

He was appointed the first Bishop of Chiapas, Mexico but was soon forced to return to Spain because of conflicts with Spanish settlers about his pro-Indian policies and activist religious stances. He spent the rest of his life at the Spanish court struggling to convince the court to adopt a more humane policy of colonization. Las Casas is often seen as one of the first advocates for universal human rights and the first officially appointed "Protector of the Indians" by the Spanish crown.

## Dear Brothers and Sisters,

During this 800th Jubilee year commemorating the founding of the Dominican Order, we remember many of our saints. One example is the young Dominican Bl. Imelda Lambertini. Bl. Imelda was born at Bologna about 1321. At the age of nine she was placed in a Dominican monastery near Bologna. She had a special devotion to the Eucharistic presence of our Lord, but because of her age was not allowed to actually receive Communion. She was so consumed with so longed to be united with Jesus in the Eucharist that she merited to communicate miraculously, when the Sacred Body of our Lord appeared above her at Mass. According to Dominican history, she died in an ecstasy of love on the feast of the Ascension, May 13, 1333. Pope Pius X named her patron of first communicants.

In his encyclical, *Mysterium Fidei*, Pope Bl. Paul VI reminds us of the importance of the Blessed Sacrament in our lives. "It is desirable to have the faithful in large numbers take an active part in the sacrifice of the Mass and to receive the nourishment of Holy Communion with a pure and holy mind...to have them draw from it the strength to master their passions, to wash away the lesser sins that are committed every day and to prevent the serious sins to which human frailty is subject. And they should not forget about paying a visit during the day to the Most Blessed Sacrament in the very special place of honor where it is reserved in churches...since this is a proof of gratitude and a pledge of love and a display of the adoration that is owed to Christ the Lord who is present there."

The city of Portland is fortunate to have Holy Rosary as a place of prayer where the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament provides an oasis of prayer and peace for a troubled region and world. It is a beautiful opportunity to offer in his divine presence the gift of love and thanksgiving for the reparation of sin, for petitions and thanksgiving, or just to be with him, heart to heart. It is an opportunity to draw for a time away from the hectic world and meet Christ in the peaceful silence of prayer.

Eucharistic Adoration at Holy Rosary is maintained with two adorers before the Blessed Sacrament for each hour. There is a present need for a second adorer at certain hours. Please consider committing to a certain hour each week to ensure that this wonderful outreach of prayer continues at our parish!
