800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ St. Martin de Porres (1579 – 1639) ~

St. Martin de Porres is one of the most powerful examples of the religious vocation that the Church has, since the center of his life was prayer – not five minutes here or there if ministry allowed, but hours of deep contemplation in which he saw the Lord and grew in love for him. From that love flowed an extraordinary level of compassion, mercy, and wisdom. Testimony says Martin was often found levitating before the crucifix or could even be in two places at once. Everyone loves the story of his rescuing the rats from the prior's wrath, or how he miraculously passed through locked doors to minister to the sick. But the greater miracle was in how he consistently gave himself to those around him, consistently submitted his will to that of God, and consistently lived the vowed life without accommodations for his own personal weaknesses.

Born in Peru, he is patron saint of social justice because, as a man of two races, he suffered racial injustice himself; and, taking Jesus' teachings seriously, he never hesitated to do radical acts of charity on behalf of those who were suffering. Martin refused to believe someone else's problems had nothing to do with him, which explains why he continues to amaze those who hear his story, since that level of generosity is so seldom found outside of God. In this way, Martin fulfilled his Dominican call to preach the Gospel.
