## 800<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ St. Rose of Lima (1586 – 1617) ~

Isabel de Flores, known to the world as St. Rose of Lima, was the first canonized saint of the Americas. Born in Lima, Peru in 1586, Rose devoted her life to prayer and severe penitence as a solitary member of the Dominican Laity. Like that of St. Catherine of Siena, her family initially opposed her vocation, but eventually relented and allowed her to live as a hermit in the household garden. Her spiritual director was the Provincial of Peru, Juan de Lorenzana, who also admitted St. Martin de Porres into the Order.

Although devoted to a life of prayer and contemplation, Rose also worked long hours each day to help support her family by creating beautiful embroideries and raising flowers that were also sold in the marketplace. She also visited the sick and nursed many back to health, including the poor and outcast, much as did her model, St. Catherine of Siena, and her friends, Sts. Martin de Porres and Juan Macias.

Despite her desire for seclusion and anonymity, Rose became well known for her mystical visions and long periods of ecstatic prayer. Like Sts. Catherine of Siena and Teresa of Avila, she also experienced grueling temptations and feelings of desolation. Exhausted by her austerities, Rose died in 1617. All Lima mourned her death. She was canonized by Pope Clement X in 1617 and declared the Patroness of South America and the Philippines.
