800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Dominican Spirituality ~

St. Dominic established his order on the four pillars of prayer, common life, study and preaching. Supported by these four elements, the charism of the Order is informed particularly by the theological principles embraced by a later Dominican, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225-1274). Chief among them is the superiority of reason and therefore the necessity of correct knowledge of Truth (the Order's principal motto) especially as it pertains to God and the human person.

Knowledge of the truth is acquired through study, contemplation, and our human relationships. The more we know God, the more we will love him.

Dominican spirituality is positive because it emphasizes the fundamental goodness of creation and the primary truth about the human person that we are made in the image and likeness of God and are only secondarily sinners. Sin "shrinks" our humanity and is the result of defective knowledge which leads to defective love of self, others and God.

Dominican spirituality emphasizes the humanity of Christ who shows us the way to be fully human. Grace is not only forgiveness but a certain participation in the life of God; it is not opposed to human nature but elevates it.

Dominican spirituality is beautifully summed up by a secondary motto of the Order by Aquinas: "To contemplate and to share with others the fruits of one's contemplation."
