800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ St. Antoninus of Florence (1389-1459) ~

Adversity is the soil of sanctity. The century preceding the birth of Antonio Fierozzi in 1389 brought to Florence famine and the Black Death which served to cultivate saints like John Dominic, Lawrence of Ripafratta, and John of Fiesole.

At the tender age of 14, Antonio was captivated by the preaching of his fellow Florentine John Dominic. Unimpressive in his meager stature (for which he received the diminutive nickname Antoninus, or "little Anthony"), Antonio was refused entrance into the Order until he could memorize an intimidating tome known as the Decretum (a collection of decisions and judgments in canon law).

As a novice, Antonio mastered the pillars of the Dominican life. His zeal for prayer, study, and service to both the poor and the Order brought him esteem among the friars. After rejecting numerous candidates for the vacant archbishopric of Florence, Pope Eugenius IV asked John of Fiesole (aka Fra Angelico). Preferring to serve through his artistic talents, John deferred to Antonio. As Archbishop of Florence, St. Antoninus' sage advice earned him the title, "Counselor" and his love of the poor did not slacken. A biographer provides this anecdote: "He [uprooted] his own garden of choice flowers to plant vegetables for the poor, and drove his housekeeper to distraction by giving away even his own tableware, food, and clothing."
