800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Fra Angelico (1395-1445) ~

Fra Angelico ("Brother Angelico" otherwise known as Blessed Giovanni of Fiesole), a Dominican friar, was an Italian Renaissance artist whose frescos in Florence I once saw while on a pilgrimage to historical sites important in Dominican History.

Of his many works, the frescos on the walls of the friars' rooms at the priory of San Marco in Florence are especially moving for the sense of contemplative intimacy they convey. His engaging frescos can be seen in countless reproductions, but standing in front of them, I was moved to tears. Many Dominicans had lived with these images over the centuries and here I was standing in amazement before them. He placed Dominican saints as prayerful witnesses in the biblical scenes he painted. These frescos cover the entire wall of each friar's room, inviting the occupant to also enter into the scene and contemplate its mystery.

Of special memory is his painting of the Annunciation depicting Mary kneeling in prayer before the standing Angel Gabriel. St. Dominic is standing in the background, contemplating the scene.

Proclaimed Blessed by Pope John Paul II in 1982, Fra Angelico's feast day is celebrated on February 18th.
