800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ St. Vincent Ferrer ~

In 1398, at Avignon as a member of the entourage of Pope Benedict XIII, St. Vincent Ferrer was suffering from a grave fever and near death. Years later in 1412 in a letter, he shared with a friend about that time when a "certain religious [Vincent himself], praying lovingly to God for his recovery so that he might again preach the word of God when, at last, while he was at prayer...two saints [Dominic and Francis] appeared to him as in a dream, at the feet of Christ, making great supplication. At length, after they had prayed thus for a long while, Christ rose and, with one on either side, came down to this same religious lying on his bed. Then Christ, touching him caressingly with his finger of His most holy hand, gave him a most definite interior comprehension that, in imitation of these saints, he must go through the world preaching as the Apostles had done, and that He, Christ, would mercifully await this preaching for the conversion and correction of mankind. At once, at the touch of Christ's fingers, the aforesaid religious rose up entirely cured of his sickness.

From that point on, for the next 20 years Vincent trekked across Europe preaching what we know as parish missions seeing himself as the angel of the Apocalypse, announcing his theme, "Fear God and give him glory, for his time has come to sit in judgment." (Rev. 14:7).
