Dominican Sisters are active, vowed religious women who are members of over 25 different congregations in the U.S. and of course many more worldwide. They are distinct from the nuns, in that they are not cloistered in within a convent and undertake a number active apostolates. For the most part, the sisters have their origin from the Third Order, when groups of lay Dominican women formed communities to pray in common and to serve those in need.

At the basis of all their activity is the primary apostolate of preaching that takes many forms: teaching, social work, missionary work, assisting the poor, and running retreat centers, just to name a few. In common with the other branches of the Dominican Family, Sisters pray the Liturgy of the Hours, observe a regular practice of prayer and study, and live a common life.

Many Dominicans sisters' congregations enjoy an enriching relationship with Associate members who participate in the congregation's charism, Dominican spirituality and tradition. In this way, Dominican charism is extended even wider.

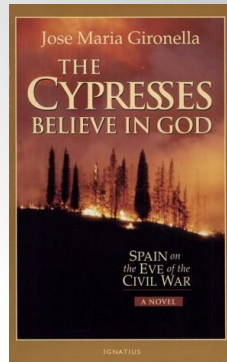

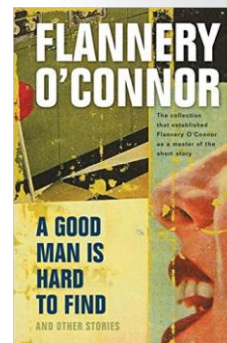

4US is a nonprofit, pro-life organization that provides ultrasound machines and the needed training to pregnancy resource centers in the Pacific NW.
