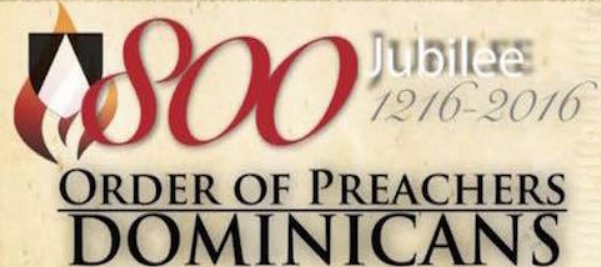

Cooperator Brothers

The foundation of the Dominican Order by St. Dominic took root in a small band of brothers. Most Catholics think of the Dominicans as a community of priests but from its beginnings it included lay friars. In its 800 year history, there have always been brothers among the Dominican friars finding various ways to preach the Good News of Jesus Christ. In addition to the many works they do, they are a constant reminder that the essence of the Dominican Order is the consecrated life. The official title of the Dominican Order is the "Order of the Brothers Preachers." The most well know Dominican Brother was St. Martin de Porres who dedicated his life to the service of the poor in Lima, Peru. There many other brothers who are counted among the saints and the blessed of the Church.

Today, Dominican Brothers are an integral part of the community sharing in the preaching charism by teaching, catechizing, administration, social services and as missionaries. They are expressing the common priesthood of Jesus given to all Christians in the context of the vowed life. They are a sign to the laity of the many pathways they can choose to serve in the context of their vocation. The responsibility for the mission of the Church rests on all the baptized. The Dominican Brothers offer the Church an 800 year-old model of actively living our baptismal commitment.

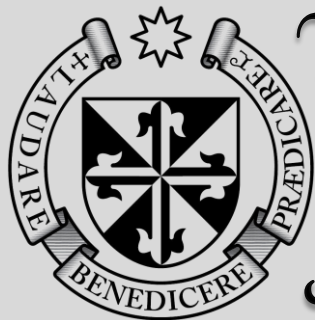
