CAMPAIGN FOR CHANGE: BABY BOTTLE FUNDRAISER

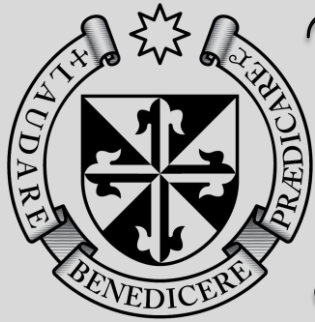
