Dominican Laity

Almost every religious order has its lay contingent, persons who serve in an established way that best suits their vocation in life. So it was with St. Dominic and the founding of the Order of Preachers for his energy drew many to the support of his cause to found an order devoted to preaching Divine Truth. Officially recognized by the Master General Munio de Zamora in 1285, the Third Order of Dominicans, known today as the Lay Dominicans, are an important part of the Dominican family.

According to the Rule, "As members of the Order, [Lay Dominicans] participate in its apostolic mission through prayer, study and preaching according to the state proper to the laity." We bind ourselves to a lifestyle that requires discipline in a secular world. As Dominicans we live out our lay vocations as married or single people, fathers or mothers and support ourselves in a variety of ways while remaining mission-oriented.

How does this work out in practice? Lay Dominicans come together in a community to pray the liturgy of the hours, to read and reflect on sound Church teaching, and to pray in turn with one another the holy rosary. We participate in the events of the ordained and religious members of our family and invite their participation in our work. We are all mutually supportive of the Dominican way of life. You, reader, may be called to this life.

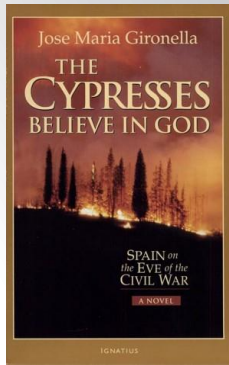

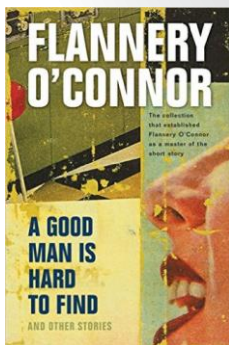
