Jubilee 1216-2016 **ORDER OF PREACHERS DOMINICANS**

St. Dominic and his missionary work in southern France

In 1203, on a mission for the King of Aragon, St. Dominic and his bishop, Diego, encountered Cistercian missionaries ordered by Pope Innocent III to preach against the heretics of southern France. On the way back to Spain Diego took charge of the failing mission, urging the abbots to send away their baggage trains and costly apparel in order to counter the appeal of the heretics' poor and simple lives. Diego then returned to his diocese in Spain, leaving Dominic behind to organize and direct the preachers.

Diego died suddenly in 1207. The Cistercians withdrew, and Dominic was left on his own. He failed to convert the heretics, but he gathered a band of preachers who evangelized the region. Their work was hindered by a military campaign called by the pope after the heretics assassinated a papal legate. Despite later attempts to associate Dominic with the Albigensian Crusade, he had no part in any military action. Rather, he evangelized the towns from his base at Fanjeaux. In 1211 and 1212 he was occupied with the foundation and development of the womens' monastery at Prouille. During 1213 he served as vicar-general of Carcassonne.

In 1215, recognizing the need for a permanent mission, Dominic and his friends decided to appeal to Rome for approval of a new order — an order of preachers.
