From this source all sacraments and sacramentals draw their power. (CC 1670) We see, therefore, that the Church clearly teaches that all grace, including that of final perseverance, is won for us by the Passion, Death and Resurrection of the Lord. Simply wearing the Brown Scapular does not confer that same result, but it reminds us of our ultimately goal and the patronage of the Blessed Virgin Mary. BROWN SCAPULAR ENROLLMENT

Saturday, July 18, following the 8:00 AM Mass

Each third Saturday of month a chapter of Secular Carmelites meet at Holy Rosary Church. This July, their meeting falls two days after the Feast of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel. The Carmelite Family has for 750 years been the custodian of one of the most popular sacramentals in the Catholic Devotional life, The Brown Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel. On July 18 we welcome Fr. Thomas Reeves, OCD who will share this gift of the Carmelite Order to the Church and enroll attendees in this wonderful sign of God's love.

What is the Brown Scapular?

The Brown Scapular is a sign approved by the Church and accepted by the Carmelite Order as an external sign of love for Mary, of the trust her children have in her, and of commitment to live like her...It is best understood in the context of our Catholic faith...and is an outward sign of the protection of the Blessed Virgin Mary, our sister, mother and queen. It offers an effective symbol of Mary's protection...as [Christians] strive to fulfill their vocation as defined by the Carmelite Rule of Saint Albert: "to live in allegiance to Jesus Christ." Sacramentals do not confer the grace of the Holy Spirit in the way that the sacraments do, but by the Church's prayer they prepare us to receive grace and dispose us to cooperate with it. For well-disposed members of the faithful, the liturgy of the sacraments and sacramentals sanctifies almost
