800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Lacordaire and Jandel ~

“The Dominican Order probably will not survive!” This sentiment was common in the first half of the 19th century when Jean-Baptiste Lacordaire (1802-1861) and Alexandre Vincent Jandel (1810-1872) were young men. In fact when John Cardinal Newman was received into the Roman Church in 1845 he was told the Dominican Order was “a noble idea, now dead.” It was a time when the Church as well as the Order needed to confront its identity.

Lacordaire embodied this struggle. He allowed his faith to lapse only to rediscover it in his 20s, abandoning his study of law to become a priest. He saw how the educational institutions were undermining Christian identity in the young. He sensed the necessity of preaching that would speak to a new generation, deciding to enter the Dominicans, wishing to reestablish the Order in France.

If Lacordaire reflects a restoration of the Order governed by its mission to preach and teach Jandel shows us another side, emphasizing monastic observances, traditions, customs, and governance, eventually serving as Master of the Order.

These two men were vices of renewal and reform in the Order, one through preaching, the other through the Rule. Both represent one moment in the Order’s 800 year legacy. Lacordaire wisely observed “it is not genius, nor glory, nor love that reflects the greatness of the human soul; it is kindness.”
