800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Fr. Marie-Joseph Lagrange, O.P. (1855-1938) ~

In 1890, Father Marie-Joseph Lagrange, O.P. arrived at St. Stephen's Priory in Jerusalem to found the Ecole Biblique et Archeologique Francaise. Taking inspiration from its location in the Holy Land, Lagrange created a school at which the Bible would be studied in the land which produced it; the biblical text would be informed by the terrain; manuscript and monument would be studied together.

Lagrange spent the rest of his life building up a renowned faculty of Dominican researchers and establishing the Ecole Biblique as the leading Dominican center of biblical research in the world, widely recognized for its contribution to biblical scholarship and the Church, most prominently by Pope Pius XII in *Divino afflante Spiritu*. Subsequent generations have sustained and furthered Lagrange's original vision. The Ecole has been instrumental in the preservation and study of the Dead Sea Scrolls since their discovery. The Ecole created the original French language Jerusalem Bible, later translated into English, establishing a model of text accompanied by notes which many editions of the Bible still follow.

Today, the Ecole is involved in producing electronic editions of the Bible. The Ecole maintains one of the premier biblical research libraries in the world, utilized by scholars worldwide. The cause for the beatification of the Ecole's visionary founder was opened in 1988.

From the Pastor...

19TH ANNUAL WILLIAM BYRD FESTIVAL

Holy Rosary Church has the pleasure of hosting all of the Sacred Liturgies associated with this year's William Byrd Festival sponsored by Cantores in Ecclesia. I want to make everyone aware of some very important and significant liturgical changes during the event lasting from August 6 through August 15.

1. Our friend, the Most Rev. Basil Meeking, Bishop Emeritus of Christchurch New Zealand, will be the celebrant of the Vigil Masses of August 6 and 13, the 11 AM Mass of August 14, and the Noon Mass of August 15.

2. The Saturday Vigil Masses of August 6 and 13 and the Noon Mass of August 15 will be much lengthier than usual and mostly in Latin. The first two will be celebrated according to the Ordinary Form of the Roman Rite and the one on August 15 will be celebrated according to the Extraordinary Form.

3. From August 5 through 15 ALL MASSES CELEBRATED at Holy Rosary Church will be celebrated *AD ORIENTEM*, that is, the priest will face the altar. This is to avoid the constant need to switch the altar back and forth during the festival. It will also provide a time *ad experimentum* for the consideration of altar orientation in the future. The altar will return to *versus populum* on August 16, with the exception of the weekly Dominican Rite Mass on Sunday.
