Dominican friars in the United States are affiliated into four general regions, also known as provinces.

The Province of the Holy Most Name of Jesus, commonly referred to as the "Western Dominican Province," was founded in 1850 during the California Gold Rush. From the very beginning, the territory of the Western Dominican Province has been a place in great need of evangelization and missionary activity. Our original purpose was to bring the Catholic faith to a rapidly growing population in the Western United States. While the population continues to grow, our challenge today is a bit different. With secularism, atheism, and religious apathy on the rise, particularly on the west coast, the need for Dominican preachers is greater than ever.

Today the Province of the Most Holy Name of Jesus continues to be at the forefront of teaching and preaching for the salvation of souls. We serve in parishes and campus ministries, international missions, special ministries for evangelization, prayer, education, and service to the poor and sick; as well as at the Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology, which trains the future leaders of our Church and world. There are currently 150 friars in the Province, preaching the Gospel in virtually every major city across the Western United States – from Anchorage, Alaska to San Diego, California to Salt Lake City, Utah.

PRINCIPLES AND CHOICES: Sunday High School CCD

Principles & Choices is an innovative high school curriculum centered on master principles of logic, ethics and justice. This program, offered as part of our parish CCD program on Sunday mornings for post-Confirmation teens, provides strong philosophical education in ten core principles that ground Church teachings concerning respect for human life, social justice, and many other issues in contemporary culture and their own lives. Discovering the true meaning of "happiness," "quality of life," and "freedom," students gain the confidence and necessary preparation to defend their beliefs among peers. In this course, "students are given tools to critique all that hits them through the media, to make good moral decisions about all the information coming at them in every direction and to understand how Christ is needed in our culture. ... People hunger for Christ without knowing it, and if we form our young people well, they will be good, insightful, wise, and holy evangelizers who bring Christ to others." ~ Archbishop Peter Sartain

THE FEAST OF THE SEVEN SORROWS OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

will be celebrated with a Solemn High Mass according to the Dominican Rite on Thursday, September 15, at 7:00 PM. The feast originated in Germany during the fifteenth century and was extended to the whole church in 1715. Its object is to honor the seven chief sorrows of our Lady. It has long been a solemnity in the Order of the Servites but it is only since the pontificate of Pope Pius X who changed its former date, the third Sunday of September to September 15, that it has been kept by the whole Church as a double of II Class. Cantores in Ecclesia will sing Palestrina’s *Missa ‘Sine nomine’* and his eight-part setting of the Sequence *Stabat Mater dolorosa*. Other music will include Victoria’s *Ave Maria* for eight voices and the Gregorian Proper for the feast. A wine and cheese reception will follow the Mass in Siena Hall.
