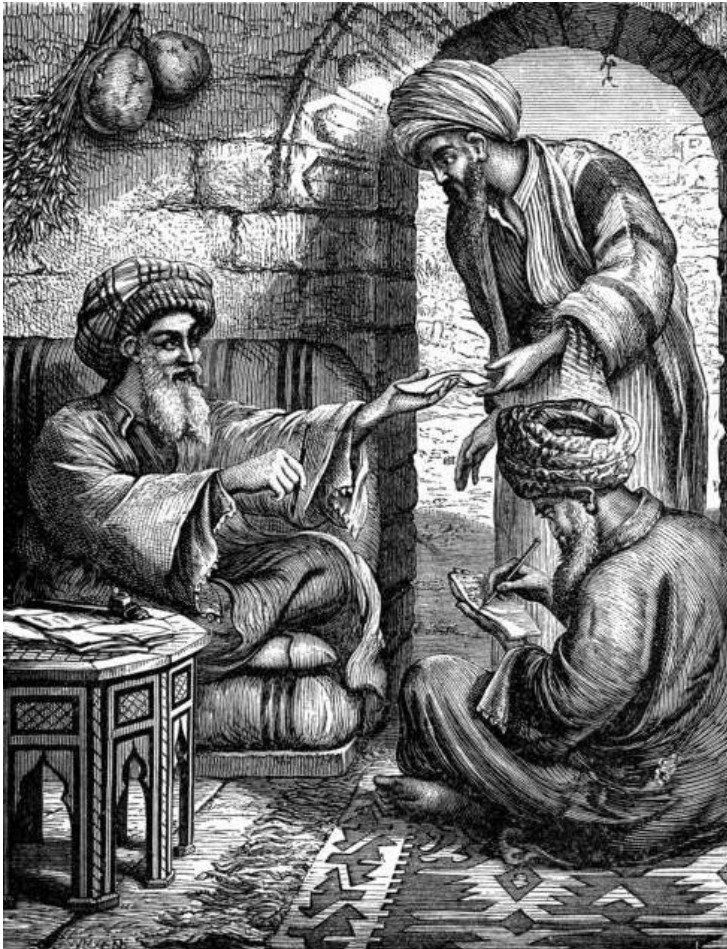

## 800<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of the Dominican Order

### ~ Dominican School of Philosophy and Theology ~

The Dominican Order predates the concept of priestly seminaries. Rather, within the Order of preachers, each house is a place of prayer and study. Since the foundation of the Order, Dominican Friars have also taught in and attended major universities. Most often the academic pursuits of the Dominicans have focused on the “sacred sciences” of philosophy, theology, sacred scripture, and canon law. There are exceptions especially in the areas of general science, medicine, language, and history.

The Dominican School of Philosophy & Theology is a community of scholars committed to the pursuit of truth as revealed in the Gospel and discovered by human reason. Following the example of St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P., the School draws from the rich traditions of classical philosophy and Catholic theology in order to prepare men and women for academic and apostolic vocations.

The School is located in Berkley, California. While a separate institute, the students of DSPT can cross register at UC Berkley and the other religious schools and seminaries in the area. As a Center of Studies for the Order of Preachers and an apostolate of the Province of the Most Holy Name of Jesus, one of the School's goals is to foster life-long learners who will engage contemporary scholarship and contemporary issues which are of importance to the Church, the academy, and society.
