~ Dominican Novitiate in San Francisco ~

The Dominican novitiate in San Francisco gives a discerning young man the opportunity to test his vocation as a Friar Preacher in the Province of the Holy Name of Jesus. Every novice steps out of a lifestyle often tuned to success and achievement into a communal, gospel-centered life dedicated to “preaching and the salvation of souls.” The novitiate is a necessary time to live out the Dominican life to see if it is where the Lord is calling them to serve him.

One component of the novitiate year is deeper self-awareness. Only the man who knows himself can freely give himself to the Lord through poverty, chastity and obedience. Prayer is the heart of a preacher's life and ministry. Private contemplative and choral prayer of the Divine Office are anchors of Dominican life that the novice learns firsthand.

As the Dominican life is communal, the novice discovers how we grow together in oneness of heart and soul. The novitiate begins to develop the skills of fraternal life for corroboration in the apostolic life.

This year is a rich exposure to the Dominican heritage of our customs, governance, manner of prayer, pursuit of truth, love of study, and service to the Holy Church. In the end some leave to pursue a vocation elsewhere, but most make profession at the end of the year and proceed to continuing formation and formal studies in Oakland.

NOON MASS CHANGES

We have made a few simple changes to the Noon Mass to bring a greater solemnity and dignity to our liturgical celebration and prayer. 1. Readers will vest in an alb if they are also serving at the altar in the absence of altar servers. 2. The Entrance Antiphon and Communion Antiphon will be read by the priest for the time being because of the frequent case where the proper text is not in the missalette. 3. Following Noon Mass the priest exposes the Blessed Sacrament and intones the hymn *O Salutaris*. Following this, the prayer "O Sacred Banquet" of St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P. will be recited. The text is found below, but it can also be found on the parish devotion card in the pews.

O God, in this wonderful Sacrament you have left us a Memorial of your Passion.
