800th Jubilee of the Dominican Order

~ Toward the Future ~

Not many organizations have been around for 800 years. The Dominicans have survived this long for two reasons.

First, because our mission of preaching is at the heart of the Church's life. No preaching, no Church. It is as simple as that.

Second, throughout our history we have maintained the basic disciplines of our life – common prayer, life in community, study and contemplation – much as they were from the start. We did this through wars, famines, political upheaval; through times of prosperity and times of poverty and persecution; through moments of triumph and moments of abject failure. There were even moments when the Order was suppressed or forced into exile. But we always came back. Our longevity is due to faith in God and plain old perseverance. We adapted, but we kept doing what St. Dominic called us to do no matter how much the world around us changed.

As we near the end of our 800th jubilee year, we have to say “thank you,” and we have to ask, “What next? How can we best serve the Church in the 21st century?” We don't know exactly, but we do know that the world needs careful study, contemplation of God's wonders and powerful preaching just as much today as it did in 1216. So that is what we will continue to do.

NOON MASS CHANGES

We have made a few simple changes to the Noon Mass to bring a greater solemnity and dignity to our liturgical celebration and prayer. 1. Readers will vest in an alb if they are also serving at the altar in the absence of altar servers. 2. The Entrance Antiphon and Communion Antiphon will be read by the priest for the time being because of the frequent case where the proper text is not in the missalette. 3. Following Noon Mass the priest exposes the Blessed Sacrament and intones the hymn *O Salutaris*. Following this, the prayer "O Sacred Banquet" of St. Thomas Aquinas, O.P. will be recited. The text is found below, but it can also be found on the parish devotion card in the pews.

Leader: O Sacred Banquet, *Together:* in which Christ becomes our Food, the memory of his Passion is celebrated, the soul is filled with grace and a pledge of future glory is given to us. *Leader:* You gave them bread from heaven. *All:* Containing every blessing. *Leader:* Let us pray. O God, in this wonderful Sacrament you have left us a Memorial of your Passion. Help us, we beg you, so to reverence the sacred Mysteries of your Body and Blood, that we may constantly feel in our lives the effects of your redemption, who live and reign forever. Amen.
