LECTURES ON OUR LADY: A THREE PART SERIES

Contemplative Preacher of the Word: How the Patristic vision of Mary can inform our own Dominican devotion to Our Lady
The place of Our Lord's mother in the life of the early Christian Church is often obscured in our day by the concerns of later controversies and the elusiveness of the available evidence. These talks will seek to offer an introduction to the place of the Blessed Virgin in the spiritual lives and theological visions of Christians of the first few centuries after Christ. What role did Mary play in larger theological reflections about her Son and the nature of salvation? When did Christians first begin to seek her intercession? Finally, an attempt will be made to see how this vision can add to our own understanding of Our Lady, and our own devotion to her, especially in the context of the Dominican tradition.

Speaker: Fr. Ambrose Sigman, O.P. Entered Order in 2005. Ordained a Priest in San Francisco on May 31, 2013. Parochial Vicar at St. Raymond's in Menlo Park, CA from 2013-2015. Currently a resident at San Clemente, Rome, studying for a doctorate in Patristics at the Pontifical Oriental Institute.

CCD REGISTRATION

Following all Masses on the weekend of September 9-10, and all Sunday Masses on September 17, the Confirmation and First Holy Communion teachers will be available to assist with CCD Registration. Please note: if you will be enrolling any of your children for sacramental preparation, there will be an important folder for you to pick up in addition to the registration forms. The folders, blue for First Holy Communion and red for Confirmation, include sacramental forms to be submitted at registration, as well as verification of baptism. HIGH SCHOOL CCD

St. Peter calls us to "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence" (1 Peter 3:15, RSV-CE). This fall, we will be offering a course aimed at preparing our youth to do just that. Based on the Beginning Apologetics books from San Juan Catholic Seminars and materials from Catholic Answers, the course will be taught by Suchi Myjak on Sunday mornings after the 9 AM Mass. Post-Confirmation high-school students are invited to join the class and learn how to respond to atheists, relativists, Protestants, and others who question their beliefs, and present the Catholic perspective on major issues based on reason, Scripture, and history. We will also practice answering typical objections and learn about resources to find answers. It is our hope that this course will both enrich students' understanding of their faith and enable them to defend it ably and charitably. Our main ambition is to ensure that pupils leave serenely confident that there is a convincing reply to the strongest criticisms that can be brought against Catholicism.
